MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER



Dear Students, Parents and Carers,

Term 6 and Our New Behaviour Systems

I hope that you and your families all had a wonderful Half Term. As our Deputy Headteacher, Mr Sheppard, shared with students, parents and carers before the break, we have started Term 6 with a new behavioural system. From my discussions this week, it is evident how positively this has been received by our community as we



restate our expectations as a school. Staff, students, parents and carers have all talked about the improved standards of behaviour and uniform.

At the heart of the behaviour reset is a focus on the many students getting it right every lesson, day in, day out. Looking through the data at the end of the week, it is brilliant to see how many ACHIEVE points students have obtained. These far outweigh any negatives. It is our intention to encourage even more positivity through a series of weekly and termly prizes. This started today with the presentation of doughnuts to tutor groups Dorney 4, Dorney 3 and Windsor 1, who from Monday to Thursday received the most ACHIEVE points. 

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The science technician team at Furze Platt currently consists of six staff members who work across two science prep rooms. We are looking for someone to join the team and contribute to the provision of technical support to members of the science teaching team to enable them to achieve the targets set out in the Science Department Plan.

You will be involved in a whole range of tasks primarily with a focus on the chemistry side of science including preparing Key Stage 3 to Key Stage 5 practical lessons and taking a lead in ensuring the prep rooms are kept in a tidy condition and that all preparations for practical lessons meet safety requirements. You will prepare paper resources for Key Stage 4 and Key Stage 5 start of topic criteria resources, and end of topic tests, oversee safety checks, and keep up to date records as well as prepare and co-ordinate cover work for Cover Supervisors in the absence of teachers. You will take responsibility for the management of the prep rooms, including safety elements on the rare occasions that the Lead/Assistant Lead Technicians are absent. Training will be provided where there are gaps, and you will be surrounded by a supportive team.




