
Good luck to all our students embarking on their DoE expeditions in the next few weeks.



#### **DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD SCHEME LETTERS TO REFUGEES**





Year 9 students from the 9F Duke of Edinburgh group have been learning about refugeehood. The group has learned what defines a refugee, asylum seeker, and economic migrants. The group discovered that often refugees flee to the nearest safe country and therefore the UK hosts a small minority of the world's refugee population.

The group decided to write letters to welcome refugees to the local area and school community. You can see a copy of the group's letter below.

Hello,

Welcome to Maidenhead. We want to welcome you into a safe and welcoming environment. We all understand that you are going through a hard time and may struggle to settle in. We hope that you enjoy exploring our town and can find things that you can do throughout the week such as going to parks, leisure centres, and the town centre. School may be a bit scary at first however, you will be welcomed and make plenty of friends. Everyone is so excited to meet you and we are looking forward to welcoming you to our community. Did you know Bob Marley fled Jamaica due to his life feeling threatened?

He came to the UK as a refugee.

Did you know Dua Lipa and Rita Ora are both refugees from Kosovo?

Did you know that Freddie Mercury fled Tanzania? He's just one example of a refugee who went on to achieve amazing things.

Did you know Einstein was a refugee? The rise of the Nazis and anti-semitism meant he feared for his life and in 1933 he moved to America.


A massive thank you to everyone for your continued support and to the PTFA Committee for their sustained efforts and commitment.


