Dear Students, Parents and Carers,

Welcome Back



MESSAGE FROM OUR MATHS DEPARTMENT

YEARS 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11

Students in Years 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 should bring a scientific calculator to every maths lesson. The department recommend the Casio fx-83GTx which are widely available to purchase on the high street, including WH Smith, Ryman, Argos and Wilko, usually costing around £12 or less.

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LAPTOPS FOR LEARNING - YEAR 7 AND YEAR 10



Thank you to all parents and carers of students in Years 7 and 10 - our first year groups in the scheme - who have supported Laptops for Learning and enabled us to launch this September. You are doubtlessly using the instructions sent earlier this week to set up laptops ready for starting next Monday 12th September.

While the vast majority of our students now have laptops, we are aware that a minority of students, parents and carers are still sourcing a laptop (for example, because a student has moved school or was previously on our waiting list). Like other parents and carers you are welcome to source a laptop yourselves (please refer to the minimum specification on our website using the link below.

However, several parents and carers have asked if they could join the school scheme. The purpose of this mail is to let you know that we will shortly be re-opening the ordering portal and will send out further details once we have finalised everything with our supplier. In the meantime, teachers will make allowances for those students awaiting laptops in lessons.



TERM 1 CLUBS (SEPTEMBER TO OCTOBER HALF TERM 2022)

Parents and carers of students in all year groups should have received invitations today (Friday 9th September 2022) to attend clubs for their son/daughter. In addition, parents and carers may wish to sign up to My EVOLVE for an overview of clubs, what's on etc – you can do this from the club or academic support clinic emails sent to you in two easy steps:

1. Click on the link in the email as usual to see clubs/ clinics

2. Click 'create account' button.

PLEASE NOTE:

* All bookings for Term 1 (September/October 2022) must be made through the original email invitations sent out today

* Once in the list of clubs or academic support clinics, click on the name of the activity or session you wish to book, choose the dates and scroll down to press confirm

* Please do not duplicate club bookings per session

* If you have emailed the school to request a place for your child, please note these will not constitute a booking and you will need to book their space through the EVOLVE email links instead

* Bookings for Fitness Club - these have been limited to 30 students at a time per session. This will be rotated but please be aware that your son/daughter may not have a place each week. You will be notified when they are to attend

*Bookings for Open Gym: Students wishing to attend Open Gym should see Mr Djaelani with their training programme; he will then register them once he has approved their programme




