YOUNG CARERS AND PREVIOUSLY LOOKED **AFTER CHILDREN**



Young Carers

As a community we are aware that a number of our young people provide a caring role within the family home. There are currently 800, 000 young carers in England alone.

A young carer is defined as someone under the age of 18 who looks after a family member or friend who has a physical or mental health condition or who is dealing with addiction. This may be a parent, sibling or another adult living within the family home.

We recognise that young carers are providing vital support for their loved ones and may wish to access some additional support via the school. We are able to offer support from in school services or from the specialist young carers service, Family Action Young Carers.

Previously Looked After Children

If your child is adopted or living with you under a Special Guardianship or Child Arrangements Order, the school will be able to claim additional funding each year to support their social, emotional and academic needs. If your child meets this criteria and the school is unaware, notifying us could help your child received the additional support they are entitled to.

The Department for Education requires the school to be provided with evidence of the child's status such as the relevant legal order. Please be ensured that such evidence and information will be treated in the strictest confidence.

Miss L Lewis is the schools Designated Teacher for Looked After and Post Looked After Students and can provide support and guidance for students and their families. Please contact laura.lewis@furzeplatt.net if you would like to discuss further.




