CAREERS FORTNIGHT



From Monday 21st November until Friday 2nd December Furze Platt has been embracing careers fortnight. Each department has created specific tasks linked to careers that will be taught across the two weeks.

- In PE students have been allocated roles linked to careers and have really embraced being Sports Journalists, Technique Coaches, Sports Analysts, Managers and more.
- · In Psychology students have been researching using the British Psychological Society and careers linked to clinical Psychologists.
- In English students have been creating performance poetry, acting as publishers, creating PR campaigns, understanding the work of a poet, and writing articles as newspaper and magazine journalists.
- Geography students have been completing carousel tasks that research Geography related careers and understanding how to research effectively.
- In Maths students have had a lesson to solve problems linked to careers.
- In Science students have been completing careers quizzes to find out which Science career is best suited to them.
- In Music students have been exploring Music Therapy.
- In Drama students have been focussing on the skills the subject lets them practice and how it links to the workplace. In addition, students have had roles such as: director, set designer, lighting designer and performer.
- In Business Studies students have had an opportunity to complete an apprenticeship quiz and learn more about Business related jobs such as HR, Publicity Assistant and Hotel Managers.
- In MfL students have been looking at their careers passports to understand how languages supports many career options.
- In Philosophy and Religion students have been exploring the wide variety of careers that the skills

developed in the subject can support with.

- In PSHE students have been graphic designers and wellbeing champions for anti-smoking campaigns, financial ethics advisors and politicians. Students in Year 11 have had dedicated careers lessons exploring their future options, apprenticeships, universities, Colleges and Sixth Form.
- In Computer Science students have been looking at careers using iDEA. Creative iMedia and ICT students are gaining experience in post-education working environments.
- In History students have been exploring life aboard the Titanic and the role of Historians.

We hope students are having fun learning about future career options. We also look forward to seeing Y9-13 at the Careers and Higher Education Fair on Tuesday 29th November from 5-7pm. This will be in the main hall and theatre with two apprenticeship talks in 6.4 at 5:30 and 6:30pm. A huge thank you to Mrs Bubb, our careers advisor, for all of her work preparing for 40 employers, 22 Universities, 3 local colleges, and apprenticeships to be present on the evening.

KEYBOARD DONATION - THANK YOU






