


YEARS 11 AND 12 REPORTS

SIXTH FORM SAFE DRIVE STAY ALIVE MONDAY 7TH NOVEMBER 2022

If you have not already responded to our letter about our Safe Drive Stay Alive trip in November please can you do so as soon as possible; you can see a copy of this letter to follow. Thank you.

Dear Parent/Carer,

Your son or daughter will soon be entitled to learn to drive. With this in mind, we have booked both Year 12 and Year 13 onto the Safe Drive Stay Alive information presentation at the Wycombe Swan Theatre in High Wycombe on Monday 7th November. The trip is a powerful and potentially distressing experience into the dangers of driving, however, the course organisers have trained counselling staff to assist with any young person who is affected by the content.

There is no cost for this trip, but attendance is mandatory as education into the dangers of driving is something we consider vitally important.

Students will be travelling by coach to the Wycombe Swan and the trip will be departing from Furze Platt at 12.15pm. We will be returning to Furze Platt by 3.15pm. Students will be expected to be in full Sixth Form uniform, with lanyards visible at all times.

We would ask parents/carers to please complete the slip at the foot of this letter and return it via your child to the Sixth Form office.


HOUSE COMPETITION




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

Next in our series on Black History Month we are looking at famous people.

Rosa Parks



Rosa Parks (1913-2005) is often called 'the mother of the civil rights movement.'

In 1955, at 42 years old, she refused to give up her seat on a bus for a white man, leading to her arrest which triggered Montgomery Bus Boycott of over 17,000 black citizens.

The film 'The Rebellious Life of Mrs Rosa Parks' is expected to be released in the UK soon or you can read more about her life online.

David Olusoga



David Olusoga (born 1970 -) is Professor of Public History at the University of Manchester who was awarded the Hellell-Tiltman Prize for his book 'Black and British: A Forgotten History'.

Born in the north of England to a Nigerian father and a white

mother, his dyslexia has not stopped him from becoming a very successful writer, historian, presenter and film maker.

Mary Seacole



Mary Seacole (1805 - 1881), known as 'Mother Seacole' was a British-Jamaican nurse who posthumously awarded the Jamaican Order of Merit for her work during the Crimean War tending to the sick and injured and in 2004 was voted the greatest Black Briton by the website

- * if your son or daughter wishes to be removed from a club, please email catherine.johnstone@furzeplatt.net and provide as much notice as possible to allow time for that place to be allocated to someone on the waiting list; if they cannot make one week they should let the club leader know.

We encourage students to try as many clubs as they are interested in – with over 75 clubs and academic clinics we are sure they will find a number of activities they really enjoy!
