

VISIT TO THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD



'Hi I'm Anna and I have just completed my Duke of Edinburgh Gold, Silver and Bronze awards. I am currently in Year 13 studying three A-Levels with a plan to go to University next September.

I started my Bronze D of E because I thought it would be good for my CV, however I have found that it has provided me with so much more.

My D of E Bronze and Silver Awards reminded me of how much I love walking and enjoying countryside. The practice

and real expeditions were so much fun and I have happy memories of running across fields as fast as we could with our backpacks on (which wasn't that fast), singing as we walked down street and eating loads of Kendall mint cake.

For my skills sections, I undertook sewing classes: I made a dress, a bag and even entered a national sewing completion which I won.

For the physical section, I learnt to horse ride, with each stage of D of E developing my skills in dressage and being able to control a horse. I have continued to horse ride and sew after finishing my D of E as I enjoy them so much and did not want to stop.

More recently for my Gold D of E, I undertook the week long expedition (which I admit was hard and there were times I wanted to give up) however it was also lots of fun including marshmallows around the campfire, taking photos of my team at each street signs for fun and watching several members of my group having to retrace their steps because they forgot their sleeping bag meaning I had an extra rest break:).



I also completed the week's residential with the Field Studies Council in Devon, where I learnt about animal and plant conservation, took monitored water samples as part of a national program, went kayaking and visited a zoo.

Going on a residential with people I did not know was not as scary as I had preconceived in my mind: it was really good

fun, plus I gained a John Muir Discovery Award.

D of E is really well organised and it allows you to build up skills and experience over the three programmes. It has taught me new skills, to believe in myself and that I should say yes to new opportunities. I have built new friendships, become more confident and have learnt how to make smores!



As a consequence of completing my D of E, my siblings have now started their D of E journey because they have seen how much adventure I have had, even when it was hard work; it was worth every bit of effort. I genuinely recommend that you do your Duke of Edinburgh Award.'
