#### UNIFORM



Dear Parents and Carers,

The vast majority of our students continue to wear the correct school uniform. We are grateful for parental and carer support with our uniform standards to help us reinforce the importance of wearing uniform with pride and in accordance with our rules. The principle of following the rules and expectations of an organisation is an important life lesson and an example of personal integrity.

A couple of areas of uniform clearly need further

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clarification and reinforcement:

- 1. Earrings and piercings only one single stud in each ear and no additional piercings
- 2. Eyelashes must be natural without any lash extensions or false eyelashes
- Nails only clear nail varnish, no false nails, acrylics or gel nails.
- 4. Make up no lipstick, blusher, eyeliner, or eyeshadow
- 5. Jewellery no rings, necklaces, or bracelets
- Skirts must be Furze Platt skirts and without any additional hemming, sewing of pleats or rolling up.
- 7. No hoodies or tracksuit tops are allowed on site.
- 8. Students should wear their school blazer to every lesson.

Thank you in advance for your support. This week we have reinforced our expectations with a 'soft' challenge. This will involve a clarification and reminder of our rules. From next week, students can expect an instant C2 (break time detention) for not meeting the expectations set out above.

A C1 will be issued for any straightforward uniform infringement. This involves having the correct school uniform, but not wearing it correctly, for example not wearing a blazer. A C2 is for failing to have the correct item, for example not having a blazer, or wearing items that are not permitted such as a trainers or jewellery. Staff will also have the discretion to award a C2 for any student who repeatedly picks up a C1.

Students who refuse to correct their uniform can expect further sanctions. Staff will continue to be asked to give an ACHIEVE point at the start of every lesson for every student who is ready to learn and wearing the correct school uniform.

#### SKI TRIP 2024

# Vallnord, Andorra: Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> March – Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> April 2024

Arrangements for our 2024 ski trip are now confirmed. We will depart on Saturday 30th March and return on Saturday 6 th April. After the success of previous year's trips we will again be travelling with Interski. For 2024 we are once again visiting the mountain ranges of the Pyrenees, in the country Andorra. Students will receive five hours of tuition per day, with a supervised lunch hour. Instruction will be provided by Interski's own BASI (British Association of Ski Instructors) qualified instructors.



We recognise that skiing and snowboarding is an expensive pastime, and sadly costs have risen significantly over the past 18 months. To minimise cost increases as much as we can, the 2024 trip will be 5 days' skiing. Although the cost may seem high, anyone who has been on a ski holiday will know that the price represents great value. The cost of the 2024 holiday is £1265 to ski, £1300 if you wish to snowboard, and includes: - travel to and from the resort on a luxury coach, including breakfast in both directions - an extensive 5 day lift pass that covers the full Vallnord resort - five nights' accommodation at Hotel Patagonia, only a short walk from the ski lift system full board accommodation (half board in the hotel / (hot) lunch voucher on the mountain) - five hours of instruction per day with plus a supervised lunch hour. - an exciting après ski programme. - a fully comprehensive winter sports insurance package. - a full week's ski equipment hire (Includes skis or snowboard, ski poles and boots). (Please note - Not included is the hire or purchase of any ski clothing or helmet hire). The trip is open to all current Year 7-12 students who will still be at the school in April 2024. All who wish to come on the trip should pay a deposit of £100 (for skiiers) or £135 (for snowboarders). Please could all deposits be paid by 12 noon on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> May 2023.

Please note that if the trip is over-subscribed names will be drawn from a hat. Please pay your deposit via your Parentmail account (Ski Trip 2024 deposit will be found in the Shop in the Payments tab). This deposit is non-

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refundable if your child secures a place on the trip. If the trip is over-subscribed, unsuccessful applicants will have the choice of remaining on a waiting list or having their deposit refunded. (All deposits for anyone who does not secure a place on the trip will ultimately be refunded). Should a student wish to withdraw from the trip after having secured a place, a refund of the deposit (subject to an admin fee) may only be available in the event of a replacement being found.



Current Year 11 Furze Platt Senior students who plan to stay at FPSS for 6th Form will not be required to pay any further instalments (beyond the deposit) until their place in Year 12 is confirmed. You will be contacted in June, confirming whether or not your child has a place on the trip, and when the remaining payment instalments will be due. Final payment will be due in December 2024.

Please note that, due to decreasing uptake, Interski has warned us that snowboarding groups may not run – with students being asked to switch to skiing. This is not specific to Furze Platt – Interski has always merged snowboard groups with other schools in the resort wherever possible. There are, simply, increasingly few opting to snowboard across all school groups. As an example, Furze Platt had 11 snowboarders (in comparison to 50 skiiers) signed up for our 2023 trip.



Your child must have their own passport. Under current rules, any non-EU citizens must have at least 3 months to run from the date of our expected return (expiry date of at least 7.7.24), while EU citizens merely need to be valid until the date of return (6.4.24). If your child requires a new passport, please allow plenty of time for their application to be processed and notify us well in advance of our date of departure. Please be aware that no refunds can be made if your child is unable to travel due to an irregularity with their passport. If your child holds a non-EU passport they may also require a visa: the website www.ukpa.gov.uk is a useful source of information. Your son/daughter will also require a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). This can be obtained by calling 0300 330 1350 or via the website:

#### EUROPEAN HEALTH INSURANCE CARD (EHIC)

Please Note - The school reserves the right to remove a pupil from the trip at ANY point for unacceptable behaviour up to the trip departing. In this case it may not be possible to refund all of the money that has been paid.



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## HOW AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO MANAGE STRESS

What is stress? Stress can be defined as a state of worry or mental tension caused by a difficult situation. It's a natural human response prompting us to address challenges and threats in our lives. Some stress is healthy but left unchecked it can grow and reach levels that are overwhelming and difficult to deal with. During exam season, stress and anxiety can be very high, which can negatively impact your health and wellbeing- therefore it is important to keep it under control.

Everyone experiences high stress levels at some points of their life, but if this is not managed appropriately it can have detrimental effects. Bad stress, is the kind that wears you out, leaves you jittery and is harmful to your health. Some of the effects of high unmanaged stress include:

- Substance abuse as an unhealthy coping mechanism.
- Irregular sleep/insomnia.
- Unhealthy eating habits such as a reduced appetite which if prolonged can cause malnutrition or deficiencies, or overeating/binge eating.
- Depression or anxiety.
- Decreased motivation and the inability to focus, which is especially important for people dealing with exams.

However, there are different kinds of stress, and it can be used beneficially. Good stress is short-term, inspires and motivates you, enhances your academic performance. Learning how to manage stress with healthy coping mechanisms can help improve your overall mood, relationships with your family and friends, lead to less muscle tension which can improve headaches and pain, and improve your mental and body's health. Stress management is a lifelong skill and will allow you to achieve a happier mentality and reach goals. Overall, management can ease the stress related symptoms mentioned above.

The first step to stress management is learning to recognise it, such as difficulty breathing in response to a stimulus, consistent headaches, difficulty reacting to a problem or overreacting, and irritability. Some techniques include:

- Planning ahead to prevent getting overwhelmed by leaving things to the last minute.
- Breaking tasks down into smaller, manageable chunks and organising them into a priority order.
- Creating healthy stress outlets such as exercising or journaling.
- Socialising and asking friends/ family for help when needed.
- Taking break away from working to prevent burnout.
- Developing breathing techniques.

To further this, there are some websites you can access that can help, or if you're struggling mentally at the moment. These include <u>https://www.kooth.com</u>, <u>https://www.mind.org.uk</u>, <u>https://www.stress.org.uk</u> and some apps like "Calm" to promote healthy stress strategies.


The CONSTRUCTIONFest was a fun and educational trip. We learned about the different types of job in the construction industry- Connor Taylor


