TURING CHALLENGE HOUSE COMPETITION



This half term's House competition is a Turing maths challenge, in honour of Alan Turing. Within each year group, 1 student from each House will compete against each other.

Who was Alan Turing?

- Alan Turing, (born June 23, 1912) was an English mathematician and logician. He studied at the University of Cambridge and at Princeton's Institute for Advanced Study.
- He believed that computers eventually would be capable of thought indistinguishable from that of a human and proposed a simple test (the Turing test) to assess this capability. His papers on the subject are widely acknowledged as the foundation of research in artificial intelligence.
- He did valuable work in cryptography during World War II, playing an important role in breaking the Enigma code used by Germany for radio communications.
- After the war he taught at the University of Manchester and began work on what is now known as artificial intelligence.
- He showed endurance in the face of lots of adversity in his life.

On Thursday 14th September, we took 36 year 10 Drama GCSE students to the Oxford Playhouse to watch Blood Brothers. This is our set text at GCSE and students gained such a lot from watching the play first hand. Now a classic play written by Willy Russell in 1982, the play explores themes of social class and inequality. Set in Liverpool in 1960-1980, the story follows twins, Mickey and Edward who were separated at birth. The play, which is actually a musical, has some excellent comic moments, especially through the character Mickey, but also in heart-breaking in it's narrative. Students were gripped by the story and are looking forward to exploring it practically in lessons.
