MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents and Carers,

Year 9 Parents Evening and Options

Thank you to all our Year 9 students, parents and carers who attended Parents Evening on Thursday. The next few weeks are a really important time for the



year group. On Wednesday in assembly Year 9 students learnt about the options process and some of the new subjects that are available. Over the next two weeks, their current subjects will share details of the Key Stage 4 options choices they offer. Then, on Thursday 25th January we have our Options Evening to which all Year 9 parents, carers and students are invited.

While students must study core subjects, Science, Maths and English, they have various choices to make. These need to be informed by their research into the subjects on offer, their current progress in school and their developing thoughts about the next steps they may take to Sixth Form or College at the end of Year 11.

Our students have a variety of advice open to them. I would like to thank parents and carers for the guidance they will offer. Similarly, there are many FPSS staff who are keen to help, so please do encourage students to have conversations with Form Tutors and Subject Teachers.

That said, ultimately it is the individual student who will study that course for two years and (hopefully) use it to help springboard into their next courses, apprenticeship or employment. It is important that Year 9 'own' their decision and can articulate what they have chosen and why. I look forward to talking to Year 9 about the reasons behind their choices.

Year 13 PPEs

Heading towards the end of their time at FPSS, Year 13 are looking towards apprenticeships, employment and universities beyond school. While I know that the ultimate UCAS deadline is a few weeks away, some students are already receiving offers, including for Oxbridge. Congratulations to all those who have so far achieved an offer for next year.


Each student has been awarded their prize (and all other entries a consolation prize).




Fred produced excellent this about resource the Treaty of Versailles - he also included some questions (with answers) on this topic as part of the revision resource too



The London Sleep Out is to raise money and awareness for the brilliant work that Centre Point are doing. It's a sobering experience to remind us how lucky we are and to put some support into a good cause.

Homelessness also influences so many other facets including suicide, mental health, risk of violence, drug abuse and generally devaluing the chances of living a good and healthy life and drastically shortening your life span.

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This is even starker when you consider young people who are homeless.

A few sobering reminders on homelessness include:

- 1. The average age of death for people experiencing homelessness is 45 for men and 43 for women.
- 2. People sleeping on the street are almost 17 times more likely to be victims of violence, and homeless people are over nine times more likely to take their own life than the general population
- 3. Core homelessness, including rough sleeping and living in unsuitable temporary accommodations, has been rising in England. By the end of 2021, 227,000 households across Britain were experiencing core homelessness, with projections suggesting this number could rise to 300,000 households by 2023

If you can spare anything, it's going to a great cause.

MESSAGES FROM THAMES VALLEY POLICE CYCLING AND E-SCOOTERS



Dear Parents/Guardians,

CYCLE SAFETY

The Maidenhead neighbourhood police team are completing work around cycle safety in order to make the town centre and streets of Maidenhead safer for cyclists and pedestrians.



As part of our work we will be focusing on areas that are pedestrianised in Maidenhead Town Centre. If anyone is seen cycling in an area where cycling is not permitted, or riding in an anti-social manner where cycling is allowed, we will be taking action and issuing Fixed Penalty Notices.

Please discuss cycle safety with your child/children and remind them to be aware of the signs, as well as re-iterating the importance of wearing protective equipment such as helmets, having lights fitted to their bicycles and having a good bike lock for when they are leaving it unattended.

Privately owned e-scooters are classed as a personal light electric vehicle and are only permitted on private land. Riding these anywhere in public, whether on the pavement, road or in parks is a road traffic offence. If you

are considering purchasing an e-scooter or your child or young person already owns one, please see the attached leaflet, which goes into further detail.

We are working hard to keep the town centre and the streets of Maidenhead safe and therefore this work is ongoing.

ELECTRIC SCOOTERS

Did you know it's illegal to ride a privately owned electric scooter (e-scooter) in public?

That's because e-scooters are classed as motor vehicles in law. So, in theory, this means that you need an MOT, road tax and insurance to use one, however it isn't currently possible to register e-scooters in this way. Privately owned e-scooters can only be used on private land, with the permission of the landowner. You cannot use a privately owned e-scooter on the road, pavement or in a public space. If you do then you risk receiving a large fine, points on your driving licence and your e-scooter could be seized. Some parts of the UK are running government trials of rental e-scooters. If you're over 16 and have a full or provisional driving licence, then you can use these on public roads and cycle paths. Just check that your driving licence covers categories AM, A or B.
