MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents and Carers,

Dropping Off/Picking Up

Over recent weeks, the start and end of the school day has sadly been marked by a cacophony of car horns due to the impatience and/or poor driving of people dropping off or picking up children.



We have had cars blocking our parking lanes and subsequently the main highway, parking on double yellow lines as well as pavements, as well as reversing and even driving the wrong way through the one-way system. Such behaviours are a danger to our children, and I request that all parents and carers are considerate when driving near the school site.

There is only a limited number of parking spaces at the front of school. If you are unable to park in a space, please move up the lanes and circulate around to allow cars behind you to move through. Please do not stop on the yellow lines as you turn into school as this blocks the main highway and poses a risk to those leaving our site.

Please also consider arranging a meeting point beyond the front of school to ease congestion.



YEAR 9 HISTORY TRIP TO IMPERIAL WAR **MUSEUM**



MON 19TH - WEDNESDAY 21ST FEBRUARY

The History department have organised a museum trip to the Imperial War Museum, London. This trip will be challenging, informative and engage students outside of their classroom environment. It will allow students to explore History in a real-world context and will help consolidate knowledge learnt this year, particularly the First World War unit. It is designed to help students gain real world understanding that cannot easily be taught in a classroom, strengthen their knowledge of the world around them and to generally enrich their school experience.

This year the trip will run on three separate days. Your son/ daughter will need to attend only one day. Each class and student will be informed which days he or she needs to attend:

- Monday 19th February 2024 9F/Hi1 (Mr Constable), 9F/ Hi2 (Mr Wyles) and 9F/Hi3 (Miss Dempsey)
- Tuesday 20th February 2024 9P/Hi1 (Mr Constable), 9P/Hi2 (Mr Wyles) and 9P/Hi3 (Mr Cantle)
- Wednesday 21st February 2024 9S/Hi1 (Mr Constable), 9S/Hi2 (Mr Cantle) and 9S/Hi3 (Miss Dempsey)

We will be travelling to and from the location by private hire coach. The total cost of the trip will be £14 including travel to and from the centre and activities. We ask that this be paid in full by Monday February 5th, 2024.

Payment for the trip can be made via your ParentMail account no later than Monday February 5th, 2024. If your emergency contact phone number has changed recently,

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please ensure you email studentdetails@furzeplatt.net with the correct information. Please provide a packed lunch for your son/daughter as there will be no opportunity for students to get food at the site.

As with any school trip, good behaviour is important to its success. Parents and students should be aware that if a student's behaviour or attendance becomes unacceptable prior to the trip, then the school reserves the right to exclude them from the trip. This could in turn jeopardise any refund of monies paid to that date.

Itinerary:

Meet by the main entrance to school at 8:30am, outside reception in full school uniform for an 8:45am departure. We will be taking a coach from Furze Platt Senior School directly to London. We will be returning to school at 4:00pm at the latest.

Students will be required to wear school uniform and are expected to uphold their appearance and school ethos throughout the trip.

GCSE GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK - FEBRUARY 2024



FIELDWORK RELATING TO STUDENTS COMPONENT 3 EXAM PAPER (WORTH 30% OF FINAL GRADE)

Fieldwork and investigation forms a core part of the GCSE Geography course. As part of the GCSE course students are **required** to sit an exam paper focused on Fieldwork and UK Geography, which **totals 30% of their final grade**. This year's focus are Methodical approaches of **Change Over Time** (covered at FSC Juniper Hall) and Conceptual framework of **Mitigating Risk** (to be covered on the Maidenhead fieldtrip).

To support students in producing high quality answers in

this paper the Geography Department will run a one-day fieldtrip to Maidenhead town centre for all year 11 GCSE Geography students. The aim of the trip is to provide a framework for students to collect primary data on their local area. The fieldtrip will also equip students with unique experiences of fieldwork that they should be able to link to their wider geographical understanding and ability to follow the geographic enquiry process.

During their Geography fieldwork experiences, students will conduct research and later produce a brief report after their trip based on their data collection and further research.

The fieldwork will be on the following dates:

- 11A/Gg1 Mr Wellard's Class Monday 26th February
- 11B/Gg1 Mr Harrison's Class Tuesday 27th February
- 11C/Gg1 Mr Green's Class Wednesday 28th February
- 11D/Gg1 Mr Jones's Class Thursday 29th February

Itinerary:

Students will need to meet their teachers at 9.15am outside the school theatre. Once all together students and teachers will walk down to Maidenhead town centre together.

Students will need to register in school that morning. Their class teachers will register them on arrival. We will be returning to school together by break 2 (approx. 13.30pm). Students will be returning to their normal period 5 lesson after returning to school. For any lessons that they miss, it is their responsibility to find out what work they have missed from speaking to their class teachers.

Students **will be** required to follow the normal School Uniform dress code and are expected to uphold their appearance and school ethos. We recommend a warm/rain coat (weather dependent).

Students will need to bring a refillable water bottle and a packed lunch to sustain them throughout the day and a Pen and Pencil.

There will be no cost for the trip.





PAVEMENTS ARE FOR PEOPLE







Would you like it if YOUR part of the road was blocked?

Obstructing the pavement can cause serious problems for pedestrians, people with disabilities, older members of the community and those with small children and pushchairs.

Rule 242 of the Highway Code states; "You MUST NOT leave your vehicle in a dangerous position or causing an unnecessary obstruction of the road."

You could be fined and your vehicle removed.









NEW PARKING RESOLUTION

Safer Parking checklist
☐ Get active Park further away from school and walk the last 5-15 minutes of the journey.
 □ Be more considerate Don't block driveways or dropped kerbs even for a few minutes. □ Always park away from junctions and corners Parking 10 meters away increases the visibility for pedestrians and drivers and reduces risks for everyone.
☐ Keep ALL children safe Parking, stopping or dropping on SCHOOL KEEP CLEAR zigzags, even just for a minute, endangers other children. Keep it clear.
Never park on a single yellow line, double yellow line or zig zag line during restricted times. This could lead to a fine.
