## MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents and Carers,

## Welcome to Term 5

I hope that you and your families had a good Easter break. It has been a pleasure to welcome students back to FPSS this week.

As I have done so, via a video and assemblies, I have shared some key
 messages with them:

## Celebrating Success

I have highlighted and thanked students for some of the fantastic events of Terms 3 and 4, not least Guys and Dolls, the Thames Hospice fundraising and Ski Trip over Easter. However, I know there have been much more! I have encouraged students to take on new experiences and challenges this summer getting involved in clubs, activities and visits within and beyond FPSS.

In particular, I have made reference to House Points and the numerous nominations and prizes students received at the end of term. I have challenged each student to have a nomination by the end of the summer.

## Learning and Examinations

A key part of Term 5 every year is the start of external Key Stage 4 and 5 examinations. For those students sitting examinations their revision should currently be at full speed and focused on practising exam techniques alongside factual recall. If students need motivating beyond the opportunities the grades will provide, please remind them that the examinations will be over in a couple of months when they have Prom, Graduation and the long summer to look forward to.

For those students not completing examination courses, the summer offers them the chance to ensure they have greater knowledge and skills this July than last September.

## Uniform

I also reminded students of our uniform rules, notably that the shirt, tie and blazer should still be worn, but their jumper is optional. As experienced parents and carers will be aware when/if the really hot weather arrives, we will make a decision whether blazers are no longer required.

## Mobile Phones and Headphones

As has been previously shared with parents and carers, I have also explained the government guidance on mobile phone use in schools. In assemblies I have shown students Sky News coverage of this announcement:

At FPSS we recognise the issues the government are highlighting, as I am sure will many members of our
community. Responding to the announcement we are reiterating our rules to students and ensuring that they are understood and enforced. As a reminder: mobile phones and headphones are silent and out of site from when students come onto site until after their last lesson at 3.15 pm . If they are seen both items will be confiscated.

## Road and Water Safety

Finally, members of our community will be aware that tragically we have lost two students in my time as Headteacher through road and water incidents. Indeed, road and drowning incidents are two of the top three reasons why teenagers die. With lighter evenings and hotter temperatures I have reminded all our students to stay safe.
If you are a parent/carer please do talk to your children about some of these key messages and ensure they do stay healthy and well this summer, but also challenge themselves to try something new, excel in their learning and really use the wonderful opportunities available at FPSS to shine.

## BRILLIANT AT THE BASICS

## LOCKDOWN / SHELTER PROCEDURES

This morning (Friday) the school has had a lockdown drill. The drill was to practice our procedures in the unlikely eventuality of an intruder on site, a nearby chemical leak or a police incident near to the school.

The purpose is to ensure students, staff and visitors are safe while the incident is dealt with. Our aim is not to alarm you or your children but to ensure that we are all safe and know how to react in case of such unlikely eventualities.


## Revision Packs

Revision resources for each subject are on FP-Cloud under Raising Achievement and Year 11. Within this site there are links to subject-specific revision websites, revision guides, how to revise tutorials, and past papers with their associated mark schemes, examiners' reports etc.

## w/c 22.4.24: Exam Timetables

Personalised exam timetables have been given out. It is important that students check these thoroughly so they know when their exams are. Making a copy of this timetable is often a good idea. Students will also receive the official JCQ exam regulations information with their timetables. We recommend that you discuss these with your son/daughter to ensure that they are absolutely clear about expectations of how they conduct themselves during exams.

### 9.5.24-22.5.23: Exam Phase 1

The main body of exams starts in full on Thursday 9th May. During Exam Phase 1, students will either be in an exam, a revision session for that exam or in their normal lessons. However, students will not be expected to attend tutor time and will thus not be required in school until 8.45am if they have a 9.00am exam or 9.10am if they are going to normal lessons or a revision session. When students have an afternoon exam they will be permitted to leave the school site as soon as the exam finishes.

### 23.5.24-19.6.24: Exam Phase 2

From Thursday 23rd May Exam Phase 2 starts. During this phase students will attend their exams and the associated revision sessions. When they are not in an exam or a revision session they will have Home Study, where they will be expected to be working at home preparing for their next exam.
