CATERING CHANGES FOR SEPTEMBER



We are pleased to announce some catering changes for September.

Firstly, over the summer we will be installing a new second servery in our Hall. Replicating the food offer in the Café, this new servery should cut waiting times and enable all students to access food more easily.

Secondly, we will have a new caterer in September. Following a tendering process, Accent Catering won the contract to supply food for FPSS. Accent impressed us with the quality and quantity of their food, which we believe will provide students and staff with a better food offer. There will be a daily meal deal for £2.78 of a main meal + pudding of the day (or fruit or a drink). This will also be the Free School Meals amount.

As part of the school's sustainability strategy and steps to reduce plastic waste, drinks in single use plastic bottles will no longer be sold (although other drinks will be available). We would encourage all students to bring a reusable water bottle into school and refill at the water fountains.

All other aspects of our catering service will remain unchanged. Parents and carers will still upload lunch money for students via Parentmail and students will use the biometric system to pay for purchases. Any unspent balances at the end of July will be ready for students to use in September.

A LEVEL TRIP TO WOOLLEY FIRS, OCTOBER 2024

We have arranged for all 'A' level Biology students to attend Woolley Firs Environmental Centre in Maidenhead to complete the field work which is part of the practical requirement of their syllabus. This will give them experience of using a range of field work equipment and methods of sampling to obtain data, which they will then use back in school to carry out statistical tests.

The trip will take place on Monday 7th October 2024 and is £14 per student to be paid via ParentMail by 30th September 2024. It will be led by the environmental staff at the centre, accompanied by Dr Graham and Mr Barrett.

Please note that this is a mandatory trip and is a requirement of completing the AQA A level biology course.

All students will need to go straight to the centre on the day for 9.15am and will be dismissed from the centre at 3pm. The address is Woolley Firs Environmental Education Centre, Cherry Garden Lane, Maidenhead, Berks SL6 3LJ. They will need to bring a packed lunch and a water bottle and wear suitable clothing to be outside for the day.


If your child has asthma or any medications, could you please remind them to have their inhaler or medications with them should they need it during the day.








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A huge thank you to the teachers and support staff for providing so many extra-curricular opportunities to my child. These activities have created wonderful memories that they will cherish for years to come.






'PEOPLE, PLACES, THINGS'

On the 10th July a group of Year 12 students went to see 'People, Places, Things' produced by Headlong. We knew it would be good, but we didn't realise it would be THAT good. This is now one of my top plays I have ever seen. It is an eye-opening play about recovery from addiction and although not a funny topic, the writer has managed to find lightness within the dark through humour with the characterisation of the main protagonist. The production of the piece was stunning with a traverse stage configuration and a clinical set where items emerged seamlessly from the walls. The sound was overwhelming and managed to transport the audience to the same emotional state of the protagonist. But the most stunning aspect of the production was the acting. It was spellbinding. We felt very privileged to witness such talent and what an inspiration to us all.

Year 12 English Literature and Drama A-Level students went on a trip to London with Mr Clarke and Mrs Kalinowski. Unfortunately the planned walking tour of Shakespearean sites was curtailed due to morning train delays, but the group got to the Globe in time for the matinée performance of The Taming of the Shrew. The English students study Hamlet, and so this was a great opportunity to experience a live production of another of his plays. We had positions as groundlings right by the stage, and one of the group had popcorn poured all over her head by one of the actors - truly immersive theatre! Hopefully all left feeling inspired and eager for more!

SCIENCE CLUB





This past Tuesday, the school's upper field buzzed with the thrilling sight of rockets shooting into the sky, capturing the awe and curiosity of students and staff alike. The mastermind behind this spectacle was none other than the Science Club's Mr. Wright, who recently embarked on an exciting project to build and test homemade rockets.

Armed with everyday materials - plastic bottles, paper, masking tape, water, and a simple pump - the club members transformed into budding rocket scientists. Their mission was clear: to apply principles of physics and engineering to design rockets that could soar high and land safely.

The students meticulously crafted their rockets, using the plastic bottles as the main body, reinforced with paper and masking tape for stability. Water served as the fuel, with air pressure provided by a hand pump to propel the rockets skyward. Each launch was a lesson in trial and error, as the young engineers adjusted their designs to achieve better flight performance.

As the rockets ascended with impressive heights, cheers erupted from the crowd gathered to witness the event. Mr Barrett's rocket (with the help of Miss Malanchuk) reached over 80 feet, prompting excited discussions about how to enhance their designs further. Mr. Wright commended the students for their enthusiasm and dedication. "This project is about more than just building rockets. It's about fostering a love for science and problem-solving," he said, beaming with pride.

The after-school rocket launches not only provided a hands-on learning experience but also sparked an interest in STEM fields among the student body. Plans are already underway for future projects, including more advanced rocket designs and perhaps even a competition to see whose rocket can fly the highest or farthest.

For now, the Science Club members can bask in the success of their recent launches, their eyes set on the skies and their minds buzzing with ideas. As the school year comes to an end, we can't wait to see where their scientific journey will take them in the new academic year.


