

#### **UNDERSTANDING TEENS WORKSHOP**

Furze Platt is pleased to be working in collaboration with Achieving for Children to deliver an 'Understanding Teens Parenting Workshop'. This particular workshop will be to support Mothers who are from the Muslim community. We are thrilled to be working collaboratively with Arifa Naeem (Senior Family Hub worker at Achieving for Children). The course will be run in English but with translation to Urdu available.

The course will look at areas such as:

- Common worries for teenagers and parents
- **Empathy**

- Problem solving
- Responding to challenging/risky behaviour
- Feelings
- Anger management
- Stress management
- Internet safety

Sessions will run 9.30-11.30 on Thursdays and will be held at Furze Platt Senior School. The course will last 6 weeks from 16<sup>th</sup> January 2025 – 20<sup>th</sup> February 2025.



#### WAR HORSE SCHOOL TRIP

On the last week on term 50 Year 10s, 12 and 13 drama students went to see the impressive War Horse at the New Theatre Oxford. As part of the GCSE and A level course, students have to see live theatre, not only to develop their understand of theatre but also as they have to evaluate a piece of theatre as part of their written examination. It was a very cold winter evening but the effort was definitely worth it! Having seen the show multiple times before, it did not disappoint. Based on the Michael Morpurgo's book, the story is set in Devon from 1912 and into WW1. The story follows a boy called Albert and his horse Joey. The most impressive part of the production has to be the puppetry. The creation and manipulation of the horses is breathtaking. Developed by Handspring Puppetry Company, (who we study in term 2 Year 9 Drama lessons) the puppets manage to evoke to true sense of a horse; from their nervous disposition, to their loyalty and curiosity. The audience are taken on a heartwarming story that transcends all ages. If you have not seen it- I would highly recommend trying to watch it on this tour!

The next trip booked in is to see the Play That Goes Wrong. This will be for Year 9 and 10 so please look out for up coming communication.
