PERSONAL, SOCIAL, HEALTH, ECONOMIC (PSHE) PROGRAMME - RELATIONSHIPS AND **SEX EDUCATION**



As part of your child's education at Furze Platt Senior School, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health, Economic (PSHE) education programme. PSHE education is the curriculum subject that gives young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy and productive lives.

I am writing to let you know that starting 24th April, your child's class will be taking part in lessons which will focus on the relationships and sex education (RSE) areas of the programme. RSE at Furze Platt will follow the Department for Education's statutory guidance that came into effect September 2020. RSE lessons in Year 8 will include teaching about: types of relationships; forming and maintaining friendships; romantic relationships; consent; managing relationship and friendship breakdowns; and online safety, including the use and abuse of social media.

The purpose of inclusive RSE at FPSS is to provide

knowledge and understanding of safe and healthy relationships based on love and respect. This is to encourage the development of safe and healthy relationships in later life. The unit will equip students with the knowledge and skills to make informed and healthy choices; to build their confidence and skills to deal with situations they may encounter; to help them to stay safe and know where and how to ask for help if needed.

PSHE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by staff and governors at Furze Platt Senior School. Please visit the school's website:

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SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS

As we approach the end of the Spring term and prepare for the Summer term, we understand that you may need to replenish or replace some items of school uniform or equipment for your child. To help avoid any confusion or unnecessary expenses, we would like to remind you of our school expectations.

Uniform

Students are expected to return in full school uniform. Full details of our uniform policy can be found here. If you are purchasing new shoes, please ensure they are black, smart-style shoes with no logos, no canvas material, no heels, no boots, and no backless designs. Trainers are not permitted.

Hoodies are not allowed, except for official school hoodies worn during PE lessons. Coats may be any colour but should not be made of denim or leather. Skirts must be the official school-logo skirt and are available from Hawkinsport. Short, stretchy lycra skirts are not acceptable.

Jewellery

Jewellery is generally not appropriate for school. Students may wear a single stud in each ear, but other piercings are not permitted and must be removed—including new piercings. Any additional jewellery will need to be taken off during the school day.

Hair & Makeup

Hair and makeup should be discreet. Students should not return to school with nail extensions, false nails, or false eyelashes, as these are unsuitable for the school environment, including PE lessons. Hairstyles should be sensible and appropriate, with no extreme styles such as shaved patterns, fully shaved heads, or unnatural hair colours.

Earphones & Phones

School is a learning environment, and phones and earphones must not be used during the school day. Please remind your child to keep their phone switched off and earphones out of sight while in school.

Equipment

To support their learning, please ensure your child has a good supply of essential school equipment, a pencil case containing pens, pencils, a ruler, eraser and scientific calculator. A fully charged laptop and charger to ensure they can engage with digital learning throughout the school day. This helps them be ready to learn as soon as they enter the classroom.


