MESSAGE FROM DR ANDREW MORRISON, **HEADTEACHER**



Dear FPSS Alumni

It is a pleasure to write this foreword to our Alumni Newsletter. Whether you left recently or longer ago, I hope that you look back on our school with many fond memories of the staff and students you met. Moreover, I am sure that you will remember the lessons and events that helped shape you as an individual.



As you will learn from the following pages, we are an everchanging school not least this year as we have opened a new three storey Science and English block and in the coming months we will add a new Main Hall/Theatre. As we expand our physical site so too does the number of students continue to grow in our oversubscribed school. We are set to exceed 1500 students by 2022. At over three hundred, our successful Sixth Form is the largest in Maidenhead with students being leaders and role models within our community.

In addition to the range of lessons, we continue to offer the wide range of enrichment opportunities often treasured by our Alumni. Whether racing our Greenpower car, taking part in the arts, representing the school at sport, going away on trips and much more students understand what is special about our FPSS community.

Since I joined the school in September 2018, what has been especially noticeable is how our Alumni have played an important role in enriching our school. For example, before Christmas we held a Hustings for the four parliamentary candidates for Maidenhead. Alongside Theresa May sat two ex-FPSS students representing the Liberal Democrat and Labour parties with the Green party candidate being one of our governors.

I have also been amazed at how our Alumni have supported each other. When last year an ex-student made contact asking for us to provide photographs of the school to share with his grandchildren as he was going blind, our Alumni rallied and helped him out. This is exactly the sense



Our school site has changed considerably over the years. As well as our new three storey Science and English block, we will be adding a new Main Hall/Theatre. The old Gym has been demolished, and we have the luxury of a fantastic Leisure Centre on site which offers fitness equipment to our students during the day and for after school clubs, and is open to the public during evenings and weekends.

Our Drama studio has been fitted with sound and lighting technology but our new Main Hall/Theatre will offer even more chances for students to really shine, whether it be in school productions, musical concerts or as part of the tech team for those who prefer a behind the scenes approach.

Our Humanities department can now be found in what was the old English block; we have a Shine department that supports children with autism; our Science department has had a very necessary upgrade; our Year 7 playground has also been refurbished to make break times more fun; and it does not seem so long ago that our Maths block was the new building in the school!

Since then, I have completed my Level 2 and 3 Personal Training Diploma, Exercise to Music professional and Level 4 Diet Specialist in Nutrition courses.


