FLEXIBLE LEARNING DAYS

THURSDAY 11TH AND FRIDAY 12TH JULY

All students will be spending two days off timetable on our next Flexible Learning Days which will take place on Thursday 11th and Friday 12th July. On each of the two days each year group will be split in two and will spend alternating days on a host of activities. Year 10 will not be split and will spend each day as a whole year group.

Students in Year 7 will be taking part in the BIMA Digital Creatives challenge and will also be putting on a 'Play in a Day' with the Performing Arts department.

Year 8 will be visiting the Natural History Museum and will be visited by the Happy Puzzle Company for a day of maths puzzles including an escape room. Letters have already been sent out regarding the trip.

Year 9 students will be taking part in a Holocaust awareness workshop with the History and English departments, as well as a languages cultural day with the MFL team.

Students in Year 10 will be visited by the Army elite skills team for team building and group physical activities in conjunction with the PE department and will also prepare for Year 11 and develop mindfulness techniques on the 11th July. On the 12th July Year 10 will be taking part in a day focused on 'Crime and Justice' with a wide range of visiting speakers and activities.

TRIP TO RAMSBURY ESTATE – YEAR 9 AND YEAR 10 GCSE FOOD AND NUTRITION

They are working at encouraging farmers and agriculturalists to work with schools to understand more about the farming process and food provenance. We were accompanied by a BBC reporter who interviewed Mrs Crisford, Head of Food and Nutrition, and some of the students.

Jacob Sykes (Year 10) writes:

My day at the farm was incredibly thrilling and very interesting. My favourite part of the trips was the brewery where we watched a demonstration of how to make mayonnaise and vinegar and watched the cows being milked on Chisbury Lane Farm. One person who needed to milk 200 cows, twenty at a time, had to be extremely quick. In addition, I liked being in the trailer on the back of a tractor which allowed us to witness the true beauty of the surrounding wildlife and appreciate what we take for granted.

Ben Sheppard (Year 10) writes:

On my trip to Ramsbury estate, we learnt about how the farmers use the large machines to produce the most food but in an eco-friendly way. We saw how they made a pure,

SPORTS DAY 2019



REQUEST FROM GARDENING CLUB


Dear parents/guardians of students at Furze Platt Senior School,





Innovate will not refund account balances less than £5. Instead the total value of all account balances less

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



Jubilee River is not for swimmers

Stay safe as the temperature rises

Jubilee River runs through Slough and we want you to enjoy it safely. It may look an inviting place to cool off in hot weather. BUT there are hidden dangers which make going into the water harmful and may lead to drowning.



- A Depth changes very deep in most places and shallow in others
- Strong currents can drag a person under the water
- A Fast flowing water which can get faster at any moment
- Objects under the surface which can cause injuries e.g trolleys, glass
- A Dirty or polluted water can cause illness

Risk of serious injury and death In an emergency, call 999 immediately



- Enjoy the river but take care at all times even on paths near the water
- Don't go into the water for a swim or paddle
- Don't dive or jump from bridges as the water can cause cold water shock even on the hottest of days
- Don't walk over the weir fast flowing water will knock you over
- Don't push a friend in the water even for fun
- Don't hang off branches or swing out over the water
- Don't vandalise lifebouys that are there to save lives
- Don't jump over fences to get to water

Stay safe near Slough's canal and park ponds



Children always need to be supervised.

- Be careful near the edges of the canal or ponds
- Don't follow animals into the water
- Be careful playing ball games near water
- Do not try to retrieve balls from the water
- Dangerous rubbish maybe hidden beneath the surface
- Canal is busy with barges and boats

WANT A SWIM?

Have a safe swim on hot days at The Centre, and Langley Leisure Centre. Organised activities such as kayaking on the Jubilee River can be organised by The Riverside Centre.

Slough has a working canal where barges travel, especially in the holiday season. The borough also has ponds in some of our parks. These waterways also pose dangers to children.

PADDLING POOLS

Paddling pools are great for children to cool off in their own gardens. However, they also pose danger to children who can drown in as little as two inches of water. *never leave
