

Howard Moodey, an incredible pianist and composer, was accompanied by Charlotte, a phenomenal opera singer, and Jeff an incredibly talented violinist. As students entered the studio, they were greeted with a performance in Czech of a woman singing to the moon (based on the story from The Little Mermaid). This instigated a stimulus of memory and our students were invited to come up with three lines of lyrics linked to 'memory'. Working with Howard, their ideas were put into song as they were challenged and stretched by our

professional musicians. It was definitely worthwhile - when all groups were combined it created a wonderful original piece of music considering each section was created within an hour. We were very proud teachers watching in awe of the students improvising with our adults to create the song 'Stuck in Yesterday'. All of this was possible thanks to Miss Johnston's parents, Andrew and Catherine who created a link between the school and La Folia. Miss Johnston was our former Head of Music but sadly passed away last year. We are excited to continue working with La Folia, hopefully with the stimulus of an A Level piece that Miss Johnston wrote when she was taking her A Levels. 





Friendly, Efficient and Committed to Prompt and Faultless Delivery

Dear Neighbour,

It has been 15 months since we started the works at Furze Platt Senior School, and as you can see from the pictures, the new three storey teaching complex is coming along nicely.



Works have progressed well, both inside and out. The g-brick is almost complete and is just waiting for the big three storey corner window to be installed. Groundworks continue around the perimeter of the building, installing new pathways and steps into the Teaching Block.



Inside we have walls built, floor screed laid and first fix Mechanical and Electrical installed.

Upcoming Works:

Works will continue to progress inside and out over the next few months. Two major items which will be installed soon are the different shades of blue trespa panels to the front of the building and the big three storey corner window. Once these are done, we will be fully watertight and ready to progress works inside.

The new 'Drop Off Area' to the front of the school will begin in the School Holidays to help reduce disruption. Beard are no longer carrying out these works and the Council are doing these directly. However, if you have any concerns with the Drop Off area we will happily assist where possible.

Due to the push on internal works, deliveries will start to increase over the next couple of weeks. We will do our best to minimise disruption of these deliveries by reminding the contractors that we use of the time restrictions and to use our full time Gateman on all deliveries at all times.



As a company, Beard have always promoted the construction industry to young adults and this project is no exception. We had a pupil from Furze Platt Senior School carry out Work Experience for a week in July. We hope the individual gained some valuable experience and will aid in their future choices and hopefully a career in Construction.



The Site Team are working hard alongside the designers to get the next phase of the project underway.





Please can we ask that Parents & Teachers discuss with their children and pupils the dangers of being near open water:-

- Think SAFE Stay Away From the Edge
- Do not go in to the water under any circumstances NO BATHING, NO JUMPING, NO PADDLING AND NO SWIMMING!
- Do not take unnecessary risks in or around water bodies
- Do read and take notice of warning signs. Think about the hazards near to and at the water's edge, banks can be slippery when wet. If you fall in, it may be difficult to get out
