
## **Congratulations** On achieving your Eco-Schools Bronze Award


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

## DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD – ASSESSOR'S REPORT



"Erin began the process as a very shy girl and perhaps didn't believe in herself quite as much as she should. We have seen Erin perform as part of the large ensemble and her commitment to performing as part of that larger group to the best of her ability was always evident. This was Erin's first role where she would have to sing a duet and act on her own with numerous lines. She was to play a cockney street urchin in Dick Whittington, part of a double act who befriend Dick Whittington and his cat. At the start of rehearsals Erin again displayed signs of lack of confidence, but as the rehearsals went on, I have to say Erin absolutely blossomed. Taking direction well and each week we could see the character developing and get bigger and bigger each week. Erin developed a great cockney accent, and even thought about how the character would walk and move creating a very dynamic persona. Then there were the songs. Singing and Dancing in a duet front and centre for two songs can be a bit daunting. One song was particularly complicated. Erin rose to the task beautifully especially as the other half of the duet was a complete extrovert but Erin was not overshadowed, she gave it everything and it was great to see her develop as the weeks went on. Come the performance, Erin displayed absolute confidence and delivered far more than I would have imagined at the start of the rehearsal period. The development over those 8-10 weeks was amazing with everyone commenting on how far she had come. Would love to see Erin take on even more challenging roles in the future and to continue to develop her confidence. She has the potential to be a great talent, just keep on believing in herself and keep challenging herself. She can absolutely do it."

## **POSITIVE PARENTING WORKSHOP** TUESDAY 10<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 6.15 - 7.45PM **MAIN HALL**

#### Who is the workshop for?

This workshop is for all Year 7 and Year 8 parents. At secondary school children gain more independence but

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for parents this can bring its own challenges. Most of the time, parenting is great fun but there are times when it is difficult and some extra strategies can make a big difference.

This is the aim of the Triple P Workshop, giving some positive strategies to make small changes but could make a big difference to your family.

#### What is Triple P?

Triple P ('Positive Parenting Program') is a parenting programme that suggests small changes that can make a big difference to your family.

Triple P gives parents the skills to raise confident, healthy children, and to build stronger family relationships. It helps parents manage behavior, prevent problems occurring in the first place and consider what lies ahead as children become older.

It doesn't tell you how to parent, as this is different for everybody, but gives simple and practical strategies that can be adapted to suit your own values, beliefs and needs.

#### What happens at a Workshop?

It's an informal presentation, a bit like a forum. It lasts for about two hours. There is lots of time for questions, but you won't have to speak up if you don't want to! It's your choice. There's no homework and no follow up. The Workshop introduces a range of positive parenting strategies and tips for parents of pre-teens and teenagers.

The Workshop will be run by Louise McSweeney, Parent Support Advisor, and Sarah Crisford, Transition Leader.
