I have been asked several times this week when we will return. It is important to say that I know no more than you do. When government announcements have been made, for example when schools are closing or students not sitting examinations, I have heard at the same time.

Whenever such announcements have been made we have aimed to communicate with students, staff, parents and carers as soon as possible, normally on the same day. However, when discussing reopening there is much to consider as we aim to ensure FPSS is safe for whichever staff and students may return. I aim to let you know as soon as we are able.





NEW HALL THEATRE - CROWDFUNDING CAMPAIGN UPDATE



Thank you to all those who have generously donated to our crowdfunding campaign. And a special thank you to the PTFA for promoting the campaign, raising funds and enabling gift aid to be claimed on donations.

All told we raised a fantastic £25,584 from the generosity of parents, local businesses, school supporters and from the creative fundraising efforts of our staff, students and PTFA.

Unfortunately, the Covid19 outbreak prevented us from having a final push on crowd fundraising, so we didn't manage reach our target of £34,000 by the closing date of 31st March. However, we are still expecting some matched funding to come in and will be trying other avenues to reach the target. Despite the current situation, work on the New Hall construction is still progressing and the contractor, Beards, are doing a great job moving things forward whilst complying with new safe site operating measures. However, works have understandably been impacted by Covid19 and the actual completion date is therefore still not confirmed.

The installation of our retractable seating and theatre equipment will follow on from the construction work.

All being well, we can all look forward to the opening of Furze Platt's New Hall Theatre this autumn. This will be a fantastic asset for our school and the fully functioning theatre will provide wonderful opportunities for our students and the whole community.


Finally Freedom

The Awkward Walk





DAY IN THE LIFE OF A FURZE PLATT ALUMN EMILY-JANE SHAW

My name is Emily-Jane Shaw, I am an ex Furze Platt student (left in 2015), and since then I've continued training and working as a Dancer and Performer after graduating with a 1st Class Honours degree in 2018.



Furze Platt opened many doors for me, especially in Sport and the Arts, and I was grateful to have supportive teachers who pushed me to aim high and explore my career options. I studied Dance, Psychology and English Language and Literature A levels, and continued dance training at the University of Winchester, studying Choreography and Dance for 3 years. University gave me the opportunity to create work with performers who have learning disabilities and to visit James Madison University, USA, through the student led D@win. I also kept my Gymnastics training up by being a Winchester Spirit Cheerleader for two years, winning the BCA National Championships both times.



When I left University, I was filled with positivity, confidence and belief that I could do anything I wanted, I would find my dream job, dance every day and be paid for it - unfortunately, it is not that easy! Resilience and perseverance aren't the skills I thought I'd need the most in this industry, I thought flexibility, performance skills, precision and picking up routines would be ranked higher than these, but sometimes it is

down to not giving up, being in the right place the right time, and believing in yourself and the opportunities do come.

One of the jobs I've recently come back from was a four month contract in Mumbai working with TalenTreee & travelling around India, working in the Bollywood Industry and I loved it! It was hard work, with lots of travel and not a lot of sleep, but I had amazing opportunities. I had the

chance to be in movies with the Bollywood stars, dancing on TV shows (Big Brother India, Dance India), live performances, music videos, corporate events and TV adverts. I gained friends from all over the world, explored an amazing country and lived and learnt about a completely different culture.


Unfortunately, due to Covid-19, I lost all of my jobs, including at Shining Star Productions teaching after school dance and drama classes which I loved; waitressing; events and weddings; as well as upcoming work for Pineapple Dance Studios and Panto.




FREE SCHOOL MEAL ELIGIBILITY CHECK
