YEAR 9P PARENTS' CONSULTATION

On Thursday 11th February there will be a consultation evening for Year 9P parents. Due to the current social distancing measures in place this event will be held virtually.

To identify if your child is in P band please look at their timetable either in their planner or on Go4Schools. You will notice underneath the subject and teacher name is a code, ie 9P/En3. This indicates the student is in Year 9, Band P.

Appointment slots are now available. We advise you to book as soon as possible as appointment are likely to book up quickly. Please note that one teacher will cover the three sciences (and will appear under Biology).

On Monday 25th January, it was a pleasure to welcome the Rt Hon. Theresa May to the Politics department (via Zoom) and for our students to have the opportunity to listen to her about her experiences as a politician.

Fraser Quin (Year 12) writes:

"Theresa May gave us a wonderful insight to what it is like to be an MP, from winning the local election, to being the Prime Minister. She clearly outlined very useful information on the challenges that she has faced over the years, especially with controversial topics being so prominent during the course of her Prime Ministerial career. She was able to coherently answer a wide range of questions expanding over many issues, domestic and international, as well as her opinions on certain matters. She helped visualise what the role of Home Secretary and Prime Minister has on the day-to-day life in the UK and was very easy to speak to and understand. Overall, we all massively appreciated her going out of her way to have a discussion with us students and she has really helped us understand more about the UK side of the topic as a whole."

Our Politics students showed maturity and intelligence during this session and they have modelled what we strive to achieve at Furze Platt. They had the following to say about the session:

"It was an unforgettable experience that left me speechless. I was amazed that Mrs May contacted the school and it was enlightening being able to ask our MP topical questions and get responses in a level of detail that we would otherwise not have had."

"I wasn't expecting that! It was a truly amazing experience hearing my classmate's opinions and thoughts alongside Mrs May's views. It's not every Monday morning that you get to talk with a person who has led our country and it is a morning that I look forward to telling my family about!"

"Mrs May answered the questions very well, showing her ability to compose well developed answers on the spot. She mentioned that she is prepared for hard to answer questions but that she was challenged by the diverse range that we asked about. I'm glad she was able to give us some good answers."


YEAR 7 PHILOSOPHY AND RELIGION

Mr Djaelani's Boot Camp / Fitness Club


Furze Platt's Fitness Club arrived back Wednesday 3rd February with 17 students (and 2 staff) attending for the Lockdown 3.0 edition.

In the first instance students were invited if they had been part of Fitness Cub before to ensure a swift and seamless transition into an online session. The fitness club will continue on Wednesdays in term time throughout lockdown.

This week the team worked through:

- 5 minute chat and welcome
- 5 minute pulse raiser
- 5 minutes mobility
- 5 minutes to prime their major muscle groups
- 5 minutes to practice the movements they would perform in the main workout
- 10 minutes for the main workout
- 5 minute cool down stretch


This week the main workout was 21-15-9 repetitions of weighted squats, weighted push press, burpees over the weight. All students worked to their full ability and scored some impressive times. Those with dumbbells, kettlebells, or barbells used those and anyone without simply filled a backpack up and used that as their weight.


