**Returning to FPSS**

I was delighted to hear on Monday that we can welcome students back to learn at FPSS from Monday 8th March. This is fantastic news and I look forward to seeing all our students onsite soon. As with our previous returns to school government guidance sets out various actions we need to undertake as we return, notably offering students Covid tests. All parents and carers will have had a detailed letter from me today outlining these plans and more specifics will follow next week including the time of their child's test.

I look forward to seeing students onsite from next Thursday for tests and then the following Monday onwards for lessons. Like the rest of our staff, I cannot wait to get our school running once again.

2021 Examinations

On Thursday further information was released about the arrangements for how examination grades this summer will be awarded. The Department for Education press release can be found here: <https://www.gov.uk/government/news/teacher-assessed-grades-for-students>

In essence, like 2020, it will be teachers determining grades for students based on the work they have completed this time with no algorithms altering grades after they are submitted. Rather frustratingly, exam board guidance will not be released until the end of the spring term. This places a great responsibility on our staff and we will be working hard to ensure that students receive the grades they deserve.

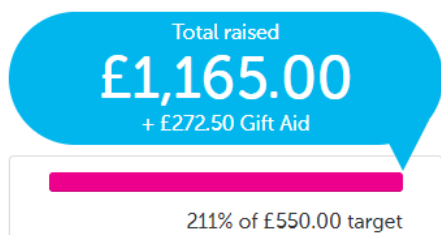
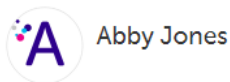
To raise money for Cancer Research UK I am running 20km a day for 5 days from the 1st to the 5th of March 2021.

My original aim was to raise at least £550 as this money can fund for one DNA next generation sequencing experiment, this helps to develop the research into cancer and help more and more people with the disease.



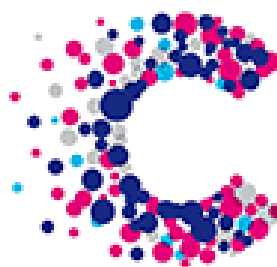
However, with the amazing generosity of people so far I have hit my original target so my aim now is to raise as much as I can!

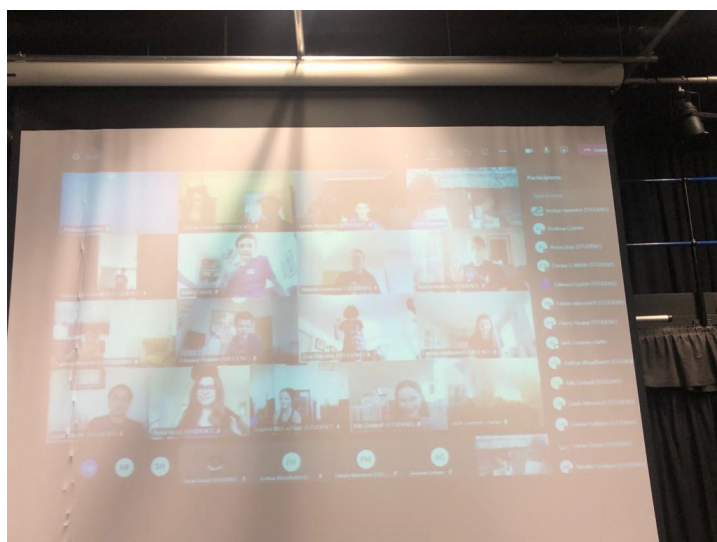
