

Guest speaker Professional Counsellor Melissa from Number 22

We recognise the current times are challenging for all members of a family, so it's vital that families are supportive to one another. We know each one will have different ways of coping to keep family unity – but what happens when individuals are no longer coping or responding supportively? What are the barriers? How do we restore communication that has broken down? Or emotions that are difficult to express? The successful applicant will be responsible for managing a caseload of students with a diagnosis of autism in mainstream education settings. Working collaboratively with school staff to provide strategies and skills and enable them to improve their understanding of autism to allow them to support ASD students with progress and attainment is an important aspect of this role.
