



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## OVER 50% OF ELIGIBLE YOUNG PEOPLE HAVE NOT CLAIMED THEIR GOVERNMENT-FUNDED CHILD TRUST FUND SAVINGS ACCOUNT

Almost every child born in the UK between 1 September 2002 and 2 January 2011 had a government-funded Child Trust Fund savings account opened for them, yet an astonishing 53% of young people who are now eligible to access their savings account have not done so.

The Share Foundation is a registered charity which works with the Department for Education (Children's Services) and ensures that young people aged 16-19 are informed about their accounts (which are already open in their name) and provides information, help and support in claiming what is rightfully theirs.

The average value of unclaimed accounts is over £1,000 each, all adding up to around £1 BILLION waiting for the rightful owners to come forward and access their funds.

The Share Foundation have also developed a special <u>web search facility</u> in conjunction with the Child Trust Fund account providers and HMRC to help young people locate their account. We have also produced <u>three</u> <u>short videos</u> specifically designed for this age group.

#### EASTER HOLIDAY ACTIVITY DAYS, KAYAKING COURSES, £5 EASTER ACTIVITIES AND SO MUCH MORE!

Live and ready to book, our ever popular Holiday Activity Days for 8-12s, and Holiday Activity Day + for 12-16s are up on the website ready for any organised parents who want to get booked in before we sell out.

Both are a full day of four adventurous activities, 9am-5pm, with lunch included for just £50. You can book online here - <u>8-12</u>, <u>12-16</u>.

Please note that these will include water activities (weather conditions allowing, everyone keep their fingers crossed) so the young people need to be comfortable around water.

**Bank Holiday Taster Days** are also back for 2022! Our first Taster Day will be <u>April 18th</u>, and we strongly advise booking early as these do tend to book up very quickly. Please note that anyone under the age of 18 must have an accompanying adult booked on with them.

We have also added <u>After School Kayaking</u> courses for the Easter term and onwards, as well as some weekend dates for <u>families</u> and adults, and <u>evening/weekend taster sessions</u>.

We're looking for 500 people to each paddle a 6.5 mile course on the River Thames at Longridge, whether as part of a team, or with your family or friends.

This charity event, over the weekend of 22-24 April (so don't worry, it'll be warmer by then!), is in aid of Longridge and the RNLI, both of which promote, educate and provide support and safety on the water. The popularity of kayaking, paddle boarding, open water swimming and boating has risen steeply in past couple or years, but sadly, so too have the incidents related to people engaged in recreational pursuits.

Row the Atlantic (on the Thames) is the perfect opportunity to educate your family and friends on how to have fun, safely, in the water, whilst participating in an exciting event and raising money for two incredible charities.

#### The Challenge

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The distance between Longridge's base on the Thames at Marlow and Boston harbour, USA is 3,241 miles. You, or your team, will only need to kayak a much more manageable 6.5 mile course on the river. Over the weekend of 22-24 April, it will take 500 people, as an individual participant or a team each rowing 6.5 miles to reach the target of the 3,241 mile distance across the Atlantic.

This is an all-abilities event so whether you're a kayaking club member or complete novice you can participate. All you need is basic fitness, be able to swim and the desire to take on a challenge to raise money in aid of the RNLI and Longridge's work in helping prevent people from drowning and saving lives on our rivers and at sea.

You choose when you would like to participate (subject to availability) between 10am Friday 22nd April and 3pm Sunday 24th April 2022.

There will be a £35 entry fee that will cover essential training, use of boats, paddles and buoyancy aids as well as Longridge's shore-based facilities and all entrants will be asked to pledge a suggested donation of £100 in sponsorship that will be split 70: 30 between the RNLI & Longridge.
