Diving National Champion Harry Healey Year 13



Harry Healey, Year 13, was crowned Swim England National AG Diving Champion following a highly competitive boys' final.

In the 3m synchronised diving he finished in 2nd place despite a last minute change of partner; he subsequently finished 4th in the 3m individual with a personal best, and then came 2nd on the 1m individual with a massive pb of over 300 points, qualifying him for the senior events.

On the final day he won the platform event, meaning he was in 1st place overall.

Well done to him and we wish him the best of luck in future events. Keep in touch Harry!

On Sunday, Connor competed in an Alder Valley Athletics Competition in Bracknell. He finished 2nd in javelin but for the first time ever he competed in the high jump. His final height cleared was 166cm which gave him 1st place.

Connor is now ranked 33rd U15 high jumper in the UK and number 1 in Berkshire.

MESSAGE FROM INNOVATE



Dear Parent / Guardian

As we approach the end of our summer term and another eventful year, I am sure we are all looking forward to some well-deserved family time and a break from the normal school routine.

The challenges of Covid-19, whilst by no means defeated, seem to be a diminishing memory and we have helped schools return safely to a "business as usual" service pattern and enjoyed seeing our students making use of the food provision, across all catering areas and service times. It has been heartening to see the reintroduction of breakfast clubs, first break services, full lunch offers and the much missed after school menu range.

We must, however, acknowledge the challenging times we all face economically, with inflation rising to 9% and forecasted to reach double figures very soon. We are also witnessing unprecedented hikes in the prices of individual products, like chicken, for example, with poultry increases soon to hit 10%.

At this time of the year we review our tariffs, in preparation for the new academic year in September.

It's been a particularly challenging piece of analysis this time around, given the volatility of the food market and associated factors which affect costs, such as petrol, for example.

To summarise, we have kept our proposed tariff increases across our range to just below 2.5% for the next academic year, well less than the predicted rate of inflation. Any increase is not an easy decision to take, but I know many of you may have been expecting a larger rise in prices.

Innovate need to balance the difficult challenge of keeping all our staff employed and fairly paid, supplying an impressive range of menus to our students, and meeting our commitments to the school which is why we are doing our absolute best to keep increases to a minimum and are solely covering rising costs but, if inflation persists, we will consult with you should a further increase, or other measures, be required.

We have a difficult period to navigate through but, we will continue to serve food of the highest quality, at the best possible pricing and we give you our undertaking to not alter portion sizes or reduce our menu range!

CURRENT VACANCIES



Level 3 Bikeability - Riders in Years 6-10

If your Child has just finished Year 6 or is in Years 7 to 10, cycles regularly or is likely to be cycling to school or friend's houses on a regular basis then this course is essential to their cycling safety. For Year 6 riders they should have completed Bikeability Level 2 within the last school year.

IMPORTANT: This course is for regular riders: imagine riding from Maidenhead to Slough on the A4: Multiple lane junctions, roundabouts and speed limits in excess of 40mph.

If your child is assessed to be below a level 2 standard, then they will not be allowed to continue on the course.

The course is completed over 2 hours.

All children booked on the course will need to provide their own bike and helmet. Please bring a snack and plenty of water and clothing appropriate for the weather on each day.

The four main elements for Level 3 are:

- Plan a journey
- Maintain a suitable riding position
- · Cooperate and respect other road users
- Ride Assertively

The cost is £15.00 per child OR free to a child who is in receipt of free school meals.
