She talked about different scenarios and talked about her own personal holidays such as going on a cruise holiday with her own disabled mother. She started planning holidays four years ago. She has made a very successful business from this called Not Just Travel, and despite Covid, has sold £1.5 million worth of holidays in the last three years. Janet has planned holidays ranging from family trips to celebrations of 50th birthdays.

Travel & Tourism students were able to ask lots of questions about our assessment briefs and she offered us advice about planning holidays for different needs for example meeting the needs of a traveller in a wheelchair which is my scenario. Janet took lots of questions from us all and she recommended websites to us and gave us transport tips about each scenario.

Message from Nick:

'The BLSR are a charity which saves people in emergency situations across Berkshire, whether that's on the water or on the ground, every single day. They rely solely on individual donations (they are not government funded) so are similar to the RNLI (Royal National Lifeguard Institution) if you've heard of them. So, essentially, the more donations that are made to the BLSR, such as from people like us at FPSS, the more amount of lives that are able to be saved by this brilliant charity.

For those who don't know, Jordan Viera, who went to FPSS, tragically drowned in the Cookham stretch of the River Thames in Summer 2021. Me and Jordan were good mates, we shared lots of classes across Years 7-11, and both went on the Geography Field trip to Iceland in 2019, a trip where we laughed a lot together and made some very funny memories which still make me smile to this day when I think about them. I, like many of the students in our year that knew him, still miss him so much. Jordan's family, who I have had the privilege to meet several times since he passed, donated the remaining proceeds from the funeral JustGiving page to the BLSR, which is the main reason why this is the charity for the fundraiser.

I have raised £400 in total so far and the goal is to get to £750. It's ambitious but I have faith in the FPSS family.

Any donations would be incredibly appreciated by me, the BLSR, and all those they have saved, and continue to save.


