YEAR 11 GCSE REVISION PROGRAMME



Dear Year 11 Parents,

I hope this email finds you well and your child's final GCSE exam preparations are going well. As promised, please find our final GCSE revision programme below which covers both exam phase 1 and 2 for your information and reference. Here is another reminder about our expectations during the two exam phases:

15.5.23 - 24.5.23: Exam Phase 1

During *Exam Phase 1*, students will either be in an exam, a revision session for that exam or in their normal lessons (there is an expectation for all students to attend both timetabled lessons and revision sessions if not in an exam). When in normal lessons, students will have a choice of either working with their teacher for that subject or to revise for another subject – quiet study will be expected. However, students will not be expected to attend tutor time and will thus not be required in school until 8.45 if they have a 9.00am exam or 9.10 if they are going to normal lessons or a revision session. When students have an afternoon exam they will be permitted to leave the school site as soon as the exam finishes.

25.5.23 - 21.6.23: Exam Phase 2

From Thursday 25th May *Exam Phase 2* starts. During this phase students will attend their exams and the associated revision sessions (there is no expectation to attend normal lessons). When they are not in an exam or a revision session they will have Home Study, where they will be expected to be working at home preparing for their next exam.

GCSE REVISION PROGRAMME MAY/JUNE 2023

YEAR 8 GCSE LANGUAGE CHOICES

Deadline Monday 22nd May

At Furze Platt students choose their GCSE options in Year 9 and will continue to study a broad curriculum, ensuring they are well prepared for their GCSEs which start in Year 10. Students will choose their GCSE options during term 3 in 2024. However, to prepare them for the demands of GCSEs some subjects in Year 9 will be given slightly more lesson time than in Years 7 and 8.

This morning all Year 8 students sat in an assembly led by Mrs Budgett, who oversees Key Stage 3 Modern Foreign Languages. This was to discuss them choosing to focus on just one language in Year 9 from September 2023.

You can also indicate if your child wishes to continue studying two languages. Further information about how lessons for a second language will be structured will be sent once students have made their choices.

The language the student chooses to continue studying in Year 9 will be the language taken to GCSE level. This is therefore an important decision to make. To help students with their decision, languages teachers will discuss language options during lessons. If you want to discuss the choice further, please do email your child's languages teachers in the first instance and they will be happy to talk through the options further.

NEW COMMUNITY SOLAR PROJECT LAUNCHES AT FURZE PLATT SENIOR SCHOOL

Maidenergy Community Share Offer opens for investment

MaidEnergy, a not-for-profit, volunteer-led organisation introducing renewable energy to some of the borough's biggest and most-used buildings launched their latest low carbon share offer for a solar project at Maidenhead's Furze Platt Senior School on 10th May 2023.

Dr Morrison, Headteacher, says, "We are delighted to be working with MaidEnergy to support sustainable energy use within Furze Platt Secondary School and our wider community. As a school we are keen to work towards being Carbon Neutral and further investment in solar energy at Furze Platt Senior School takes us closer to this ambition, as well as supports us to reduce costs by investing money in education rather than paying higher energy costs."

The new share offer will see the installation of 240kW of solar PV on the roof of the school, adding to the existing 35kW installed in 2020. MaidEnergy's biggest installation to date will provide FPSS with a long-term secure renewable energy supply, at a fixed low cost.

In their eighth project since 2015, MaidEnergy will again open the share offer to local investors for a six-week period to fund the project. The share offer allows investors to purchase shares for £1 each, there are 280,000 shares available to raise the expected funding to deliver the project. The projected annual return on shares is 5%.

Once the funds are secured, the project is launched with a return on investment to shareholders and surplus funds put towards the next project. The project potential has been recognised by the Climate Partnership CIC, which has agreed to provide £40,000 to underwrite the development of large scale solar in the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead (RBWM).

The install funded by this share offer will provide considerable benefit to Furze Platt Senior School, supporting the provision of education to young people. The school will benefit from a donation of shares in MaidEnergy, which will provide income from interest payments and a future cash benefit when the school request to withdraw its share capital. MaidEnergy has offered to donate the panels to the site after 15 years.

The project will provide locally owned renewable energy to serve the community; benefit the environment by lowering CO2 emissions; offer lower energy bills for Furze Platt Senior School; and provide a projected return for shareholders. Income will be earned from electricity generated by the solar panels and MaidEnergy expect 70% to be sold to the school with the rest exported to the grid. The school will pay a fixed price linked to inflation, while the export price will vary according to market

conditions.

To help protect Furze Platt Senior School from excessive energy prices in the future, MaidEnergy is offering to provide power at a nearly 40% discount to the current price for power from the grid, increasing with inflation, and guarantees not to charge more than the price from the grid in future. This has been endorsed by the Education Funding Agency.

MaidEnergy has already financed and installed solar panels on seven community buildings, gaining income for MaidEnergy from the sales of power and the Feed-in Tariff for renewable energy. As generation is well understood, and prices are inflation-linked, MaidEnergy's income is reasonably predictable. The rapid rise in inflation in 2022 will increase income now and in the long-term, while the addition of 240kWp of solar at Furze Platt will increase overall income by over 40%.

By buying shares, investors join MaidEnergy and help raise money to finance new installations. Each potential installation is assessed by MaidEnergy to ensure it is suitable to deliver a return sufficient to cover operation, maintenance, capital repayment costs and interest to investors.

Local resident and Co-Chair of MaidEnergy Richard Taylor comments, "It's wonderful to be returning to Furze Platt Senior School for another solar project, our biggest one so far. We need more clean energy in the climate emergency, and we love helping schools in our area to cut their emissions and their bills at once.'

This latest share offer is for 280,000 shares offered at £1 each. This will finance 240kWp of solar PV to be installed on Furze Platt school. The minimum investment is £100 per member and the maximum is £90,000 or such lower amount as takes a member to 10% of the total issued equity. Returns will be calculated according to projected income and expenditure based on a set of assumptions. The projected annual return on shares is 5%, paid annually, and will be capped at the higher of 5% or RPI plus 2%. About MaidEnergy

MaidEnergy is a community business, democratically run with an asset lock to preserve the solar panels for the community. No remuneration has been paid by the organisation to Directors for their service as Directors. Although Directors can be paid, they have served in a voluntary role. Directors are committed to putting substantial time into the society.

MaidEnergy works by:

- Finding community buildings interested in cutting carbon emissions
- Raising community finance from people in the local area and throughout the UK, through the issuing and managing of community share schemes, to fund installations
- Providing all relevant legal documents and arranging grid export capability
