GCSE RESULTS DAY - THURSDAY 24TH AUGUST

8am – 11am in the Theatre

Timings for the day

GCSE Results Day is scheduled for Thursday 24th August 2023. The school will be open and Year 11 students will be able to collect results in person from 8.00am. Results Day will close for internal students at 11am so all students collecting results will need to have done so by this time.

How results will be issued

Results will be issued in the Theatre. Students will collect their results from members of the examination team who will be at desks organised by surname. Students will simply need to go to the desk displaying the starting letter of their surname to collect their results.

Sixth Form Registration

If students are intending to attend the FPSS Sixth Form, they will need to complete their enrolment form on Admissions+ once they have obtained their results.

Students can complete their enrolment form from 8am on Thursday 24th August. All FPSS students must have completed their enrolment forms by 11am on Thursday 24th August in order to be processed before external students are enrolled later that day.

Please note, **Students won't be fully enrolled until they have received a confirmation email from Admissions+.**

Returning of school equipment and uniform

If students have any school resources, such as textbooks or equipment, please bring these to Results Day. We are very grateful for any donations of textbooks or revision

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guides that are no longer wanted.

Similarly, if any student uniform is in a good condition, we would be thankful for any donations to the school.

Students not able to attend Results Day

If students are unable to collect their results and wish for someone else to collect them on their behalf, they will need to complete a results collection form, which can be found on the examinations page of the school website.

Sixth Form registration may require students to register in person as outlined above. If students are not able to attend school on Results Day to register, they may send someone in on their behalf to do this for them. If students are able to talk to us on the phone, this person should bring a working contact number with them so we can call to discuss registration.

A LEVEL BIOLOGY TRIP

WOOLLEY FIRS ENVIRONMENTAL CENTRE
Tuesday 10th October



Please note that this is a mandatory trip and is a requirement of completing the AQA A level Biology course.

Parents and carers of all our 'A' level Biology students have had letters this week about our trip to Woolley Firs

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Environmental Centre in Maidenhead to complete the field work which is part of the practical requirement of their syllabus. This will give students experience of using a range of field work equipment and methods of sampling to obtain data, which they will then use back in school to carry out statistical tests.

The trip will take place on Tuesday 10th October 2023 and is £14 per person. It will be led by the environmental staff at the centre, accompanied by Mrs McElligott and Mr Barrett.

All students will need to go straight to the centre on the day for 9.15am and will be dismissed from the centre at 3pm. The address is Woolley Firs Environmental Education Centre Cherry Garden Lane, Maidenhead, Berks SL6 3LJ. They will need to bring a packed lunch and a water bottle and wear suitable clothing to be outside for the day. If your child has asthma could you please remind them to have their inhaler with them should they need it during the day.




