Students should be very proud of their hard work and dedication to their performances; it was a challenging and chilling evening for the audience with powerful pieces exploring strong messages. FREE BREAKFAST FOR ALL STUDENTS AT FPSS

As part of our school provision, the FPSS Pastoral Team and the Innovate Canteen Service believe it is vital to ensure that all students are given a healthy and sustaining breakfast to set them up for success over the school day. Therefore, all students at FPSS are entitled to a free breakfast of porridge oats at school. There will be a small surcharge for porridge toppings, and this will be covered for students in receipt of free school meals. This is a slight adjustment to the previous provision that was in place. The new breakfast provision will ensure that all students can access the support we are putting in place. Where families and students would prefer a different option for breakfast, the canteen will continue to provide alternatives including breakfast baps, rolls, pastries etc., and these will be charged to lunch money accounts as normal. Please note, for students in receipt of FSM, parents will need to add money onto their children's school lunch accounts (via ParentMail) to purchase these alternative breakfast items, as they cannot be bought using FSM lunch balances.

A Police message for parents from Safeguarding Schools Officer

Halloween will soon be upon us again on 31st October, which this year falls on Tuesday after half term break. In previous years, we have had problems in the local area with anti-social behaviour caused by a small number of teenagers who think this period is an excuse to behave in a disorderly way. Examples include vandalism, graffiti, egg, flour, fruit and vegetable throwing, underage drinking and illegal use of fireworks.

Please speak with your children if they are planning to go out over the Halloween period to ensure you know where they will be going, who they will be with and what they plan to do.

In the lead up to this period there has again been a combined effort between a number of local agencies including Police and Local Authority to try to reduce any such problems. There will also be increased Police and Community Warden patrols during this period to reassure residents and deter any antisocial behaviour. If you see officers and wardens out and about please chat to them and

make them aware of any concerns. Those that do decide to behave in this way will be dealt with firmly.

Please also consider the safety of your children. Trick or Treat is really an activity for younger children who should always be escorted by a responsible adult. Ideally, arrangements should be made in advance with householders that are happy to receive them. In previous years a lit pumpkin outside the house has been used as an indication of this.

Teenagers should be aware that going around in large groups can be intimidating to many residents, road users and pedestrians. Elderly, vulnerable, very young and other members of the community can find Halloween a particularly worrying time as they receive repeated calls at their door. Many residents do not want to receive Trick or Treaters at this time and their privacy and peace should be respected and not result in them becoming targets for abuse and vandalism.


