
YEAR 8 - HEATHROW STEM CHALLENGE

This week, all Year 8 students took part in the Heathrow STEM Challenge. This was organised and run by Learning to Work with the help of volunteers from Heathrow Airport.

Students learnt about some of the STEM careers available at Heathrow and then worked in groups to design and build a Micro-bit robot vehicle, which they programmed to move round a track.

Each student took on a particular role for this activity – project manager, designer, safety officer or programmer.

As well as learning about careers and about coding, students used transferable skills such as problem solving, teamwork and communication. FPSS staff and our visitors were all impressed with the way in which students participated in this activity and the skills they displayed. Well done Year 8.

YEAR 13 CHEMISTRY - IMPERIAL COLLEGE



The aim of the Chemistry Department at Furze Platt Senior school at KS5 is to build on pupil's science capital and passion for Chemistry, their chosen A Level subject. As such, a group of our year 13 Chemistry pupils (2024 cohort) visited Imperial College London (ICL) for a schools' insight day. Pupils were able to see what a university campus looks like, tour the Molecular Science Research Hub facilities and subject areas, sit in a lecture hall and speak to Professor Rob Law. The focus of the day was to provide pupils with an insight into how to apply for higher education, how it is funded, what are the expectations of universities and to support pupils with their Spectroscopy studies.

ICL is one of the most prestigious universities in the country and was ranked 1st in the QS World University Rankings 2023. Visiting such a reputable university clearly indicates to pupils the aspirations that we have for them and sets high expectations as to what we believe they can achieve.

Miss K. Lee commented, "It was an unforgettable experience; the White City was a lovely, modern campus. I enjoyed the inspiring tour around the labs of the MSRH building and this has motivated me to work towards the standard of this aspirational environment. Professor Law's lecture on NMR spectroscopy, was very informative and gave us an insight of this very useful chemistry technique."

We hope that such trips shall continue to raise our students' aspirations and that our Year 13 cohort will in a few months' time achieve as good as - if not better - results than our 2023 cohort.


