YEAR 11 PRE-PUBLIC EXAMS



We will be running Pre-Public exams (PPEs) which started with Art and Photography this week and a full week of written subjects next week. PPEs take place during the normal school day, and students will be expected to be in lessons if they do not have an exam.

There is no 'study leave' for PPEs and students will be in school from 9:15am to 3:15pm as usual.

However, when students have morning exams they will be required to be in school for 8:45am. When they have afternoon exams they will be permitted to leave after the exam finishes.

Please note that, while some exams will finish before 3:15pm, there are some subjects that will not finish until after 3:30pm (particularly where a student qualifies for extra time in their exams).

Students should also note that for exams on 13th-17th November only, when they have an afternoon exam their Break 2 will be an hour earlier than usual (from 12:45-1:15) and should plan their eating accordingly.

Students will be expected to remain in school on Friday 17th November afternoon, in normal lessons, if not sitting an exam.

Students have online access to their personal PPE timetables so they know which rooms their exams will be held in. The overview timetable was sent out to parents and carers earlier this week.

YEAR 9 ART AND DESIGN-**PHOTOGRAPHY**




The first project in Year 9 Art and Design is centred around Photography.


Competitive netball is back in the Sixth Form!


