YEAR 11 SUPPORT, REVISION & EXAM ARRANGEMENTS FOR 2024



This is a very significant time for Year 11 students. As their examinations approach, the end is in sight, and students realise the importance of working hard in order to achieve the grades of which they are capable. Parents and carers are providing a great deal of support and motivation at home. Letters have been sent to parents and carers indicating what extra support and revision we are providing in school, and to explain what will be happening in the weeks running up to and during the exam phase.

Revision Packs

Revision resources for each subject are on FP-Cloud under Raising Achievement and Year 11. Within this site there are links to subject-specific revision websites, revision guides, how to revise tutorials, and past papers with their associated mark schemes, examiners' reports etc.

Easter Holidays 29.3.24 - 12.4.24

Deadline to book: Wednesday 27th March

Revision

The school will be open during the **Easter holidays** and staff will be offering a range of revision workshops. Details of these have been sent to Year 11 parents and carers this week via ParentMail and we **strongly encourage** all Year 11 students to attend. In the current financial climate we do need to ask for a flat £30 administration fee for all students who wish to attend. This is to cover organisation, staffing and resource production costs. Students who currently receive Free School Meals, or who have received them during their time at Furze Platt, are exempt from this fee.

Please take care to only select the revision classes that your child will definitely be attending – in order that we can prepare the correct volume of resources and ensure that we are in appropriately sized rooms. RA (Raising Achievement) revision workshops are by invitation only and students attending these sessions will be invited separately by Mrs Feather.

w/c 22.4.24: Exam Timetables

While students already have a draft exam schedule, during this week personalised exam timetables will also be given out. It is important that students check these thoroughly so they know when their exams are. Making a copy of this timetable is often a good idea. A public exams handbook for Students and Parents is available to download from the school website for guidance on all aspects of the exams season. Students will also receive the official JCQ exam regulations information with their timetables. We recommend that you discuss these with your son/daughter to ensure that they are absolutely clear about expectations of how they conduct themselves during exams.

9.5.24 - 22.5.23: Exam Phase 1

The main body of exams starts in full on Thursday 9th May. There will be a full revision / final preparation programme throughout the exam period, with subjectspecific preparation sessions as short a time as possible before the exam. (This will normally be the afternoon before a morning exam or the morning before an afternoon exam - where it does not clash with another exam.) During Exam Phase 1, students will either be in an exam, a revision session for that exam or in their normal lessons. When in normal lessons, students will have a choice of either working with their teacher for that subject or to revise for another subject - quiet study will be expected. However, students will not be expected to attend tutor time and will thus not be required in school until 8.45am if they have a 9.00am exam or 9.10am if they are going to normal lessons or a revision session. When students have an afternoon exam they will be permitted to leave the school site as soon as the exam finishes.

23.5.24 - 19.6.24: Exam Phase 2

From Thursday 23rd May *Exam Phase 2* starts. During this phase students will attend their exams and the associated revision sessions. When they are not in an exam or a revision session they will have Home Study, where they will be expected to be working at home preparing for their next exam.

Details of the revision programme that will run during Exam Phases 1 & 2 will be published shortly after the exam boards confirm the final exam timetable.

I would like to thank all parents and carers for your continued support of Year 13 as we move towards the exam period. So that you are aware:

We are 9 weeks away from the start of the exam period for Year 13 students (inclusive of Easter Holidays).


Students should be engaging with at least 9hrs per subject per fortnight (27 hours total) in 'normal' terms. This will need to ramp up as we get closer to the exams and research from Warwick University has suggested that high achieving students complete between 20 and 25 hours per week.

Students have been reminded of where they can find study skills support – these are available on the FP cloud (Year 12 TSS area) and on the Furze Platt website (the study board is particularly helpful):

It is natural for students to feel high levels of stress at this time – it is hard work! We have discussed how taking responsibility for this and being proactive can assist with making this manageable. Creating a study timetable and planning for down time can be a real support mechanism.

As part of Women's History Month, students will be exposed to a range of different female composers from different, cultures, eras and

backgrounds.

This week KS3 students were introduced to Florence Price.


Florence was an Afro-American composer who had to deal with diversity

in her life. She was told she could not be a composer because of her race and her gender. This did not deter Price who continued to compose until she had her 'big break' in in June 1933 where her composition was played by the worldrenowned Chicago Symphony Orchestra, making her the first ever black female to have her composition played by a leading orchestra.

Florence was known for her fusion of Western Classical and West African rhythms. This week students have listened to Price's Symphony No.1 - Juba Dance. A fusion of American style, Western Classical orchestration (incorporating the Djeme drums), and West African rhythms. Have a listen here: https://www.youtube.com/watch? v=ooQ6YKbPiDQ

As part of the month, students have been encouraged to use the QR code on our calendar of female composers to listen to something new and not they might normally listen to.




YEAR 12 VISIT TO THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am very excited to announce that Furze Platt Senior School will be running a trip to Greece in the summer of 2025 for year 10 students (current Year 9 students).

We are partnering with Flooglebinder, a travel and conservation company. They are the first B-Corp certified travel company and are experts in delivering educational programmes that create change for people and the planet.

During the 10-day trip students will get hands on experience of turtle conservation, they will learn about their anatomy and the important role they play in an ecosystem. Additionally, students will learn how to protect them and the anthropogenic impacts that are affecting their distribution and behaviours.

Given the school's own sustainable trip targets, we are confident that this trip can provide the students with an unforgettable experience while ensuring minimal social and environmental impact on the ecosystem. Turtles here we come!
