


#### MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

## **Revision Packs**

## **Exam Timetables**

It is important that students check their personalised exam timetables thoroughly so they know when their exams are. Students will also receive the official JCQ exam regulations information with their timetables. We recommend that you discuss these with your son/ daughter to ensure that they are absolutely clear about expectations of how they conduct themselves during exams.

## 23.5.24 - 19.6.24: Exam Phase 2

Exam Phase 2 has now started. During this phase students will attend their exams and the associated revision sessions. When they are not in an exam or a revision session they will have Home Study, where they will be expected to be working at home preparing for their next exam.

#### JUNIOR MATHS CHALLENGE



On 25<sup>th</sup> April one hundred and twenty of our Year 7 and 8 students participated in the Junior Maths Challenge (JMC) competition. As usual our students did very well.

Half of those who were entered received awards. Eleven students received Gold, twenty-four achieved Silver and twenty-five qualified for Bronze awards.

Reuben Cranch in Year 7 achieved best in the school and Uswa Azam and Joshua Ng joint best in Year 8.

Reuben Cranch, Aarav Saroha, Uswa Azam, Joshua Ng, Kaylie Lau, and Nor-Aldeen Hejazee all qualified for the Junior Kangaroo Challenge to be held on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> June as they performed excellently in the JMC.

All participants embraced all the ACHIEVE values of FPSS in preparing for and doing the actual JMC. Many students attended the lunch time club where they worked on JMC past papers. This hard work resulted in an improved performance by our students in comparison to last year.

We, as a Maths department, are extremely proud to offer our students these enrichment opportunities and are equally proud of their excellent achievements in these competitions.




## YEAR WATER SAFETY
