
Many thanks to all staff, students and families who supported these events.

YEAR 8 TRIP TO WALES 2025 MONDAY 9TH JUNE – THURSDAY 12TH JUNE 2025

Dear Parents and Carers,

Some spaces have become available on our Year 8 trip to Wales this summer. Currently 110 students from Year 8 will be attending the trip and I am pleased to be able to open up a limited number of extra spaces.



On this 4-day adventure in West Wales, students will be immersed in all things wildlife, conservation, and sustainability. The Expedition also works on teambuilding, communication, and personal development skills.

Itinerary overview:

Day 1 - Bug Farm

Students learn about sustainable protein, get up close to some creepy crawlies and then get to sample some delicious food in



the restaurant made with insects including meal worms and crickets!

Day 2 - Coasteering

A costal adventure climbing, scrambling, jumping, and swimming along the beautiful Pembrokeshire coastline.



Day 3 - Speed Boat tour and explore St David's

A wildlife boat tour around a local island to see seals, sea birds and if you are lucky porpoises!

Day 4 - Foraging workshop and depart

Learn about gathering wild food from the seashore.




