A REMINDER ABOUT BEING READY FOR LEARNING


As we continue to support students in making the most of their learning at Furze Platt, we'd like to remind parents and carers of the importance of ensuring their child arrives at school fully equipped each day.

INTERMEDIATE MATHS CHALLENGE

Following the success of our Year 9, 10, and 11 students in the Intermediate Maths Challenge (IMC), we are proud to announce that four of our students were invited to participate in the prestigious follow-on rounds: the Pink and Grey Kangaroo competitions.

Gordon Yui (Year 11), Aleks Koziak (Year 10), and James Maher (Year 10) qualified for the Pink Kangaroo, while Josh King (Year 9) was invited to take part in the Grey Kangaroo. These national-level competitions are offered to high-scoring IMC participants and represent a significant academic challenge.

All four students performed exceptionally well. James Maher earned a **Silver Award**, while Gordon Yui, Aleks Koziak, and Josh King each achieved **Bronze Awards**. These results reflect the students' dedication, problemsolving abilities, and mathematical talent.

As a Maths Department, we are extremely proud to provide our students with such enrichment opportunities and equally proud of their outstanding accomplishments.

YEAR 11 EXAM PHASES AND SUPPORT



As you will appreciate, this is a very significant time for Year 11. As their examinations approach, the end is in sight, and students realise the importance of working hard in order to achieve the grades of which they are capable. Parents and carers are providing a great deal of support and motivation at home. This letter is to let you know what extra support and revision we are providing in school, and to explain what will be happening in the weeks running up to and during the exam phase.

Revision Packs

As mentioned to you previously, revision resources for each subject are on FP-Cloud under Raising Achievement and Year 11. Within this site there are links to subject-specific revision websites, revision guides, how to revise tutorials, and past papers with their associated mark schemes and examiners' reports etc. In addition, students are welcome to pick up paper copies of any revision tools, i.e. workbooks, past papers etc from our Raising Achievement department.

Exam Timetables

While students already have access to their exam schedule online via examsassist.co.uk. It is important that students check these thoroughly, so they know when their exams are. Making a copy of this timetable is often a good idea. A public exams handbook for Students and Parents is available to download from the school website for guidance on all aspects of the exams season, as are the official JCQ exam regulations. We recommend that you discuss these with your son/daughter to ensure that they are absolutely clear about expectations of how they conduct themselves during exams.

Exam Phase 1 - Thursday 8.5.25 - Thursday 22.5.25 (inclusive)

There will be a full revision / final preparation programme throughout the exam period, with subject-specific preparation sessions as short a time as possible before the exam.

(This will normally be the afternoon before a morning exam or the morning before an afternoon exam – where it does not clash with another exam.) During *Exam Phase 1*, students will either be in an exam, a revision session for that exam or in their normal lessons. When in normal lessons, students will have a choice of either working with their teacher for that subject or to revise for another subject – quiet study will be expected. However, students will not be expected to attend tutor time and will thus not be required in school until 8.45 if they have a 9.00am exam or 9.10 if they are going to normal lessons or a revision session. When students have an afternoon exam they will be permitted to leave the school site as soon as the exam finishes.

Exam Phase 2 – Friday 23.5.25 – Wednesday 18.6.25 (inclusive)

From Friday 23rd May *Exam Phase 2* starts. During this phase students will attend their exams and the associated revision sessions. When they are not in an exam or a revision session they will have Home Study, where they will be expected to be working at home preparing for their next exam. Access to the library to study during phase 2 is possible for limited number of students, however permission will need to be given by myself or Mr Djaelani in advance. Please contact us if you would like your child to be considered. Mr Wellard-Jeffs and Mr Djaelani will be opening classrooms H4 and H8 each morning for Year 11 students who want to come in early to study before their exams.

In addition to last week's Year 11 assembly focusing on advice and guidance during their exams, students also have access to a range of support resources. Please see the presentation on advice and guidance during exams below plus a link to access to GCSEPod and FP Cloud Resources.



STUDENT ABSENCE AND PENALTIES

May 2025


Dear parent/carer,

This communication is to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- 1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in The Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in The Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice - The Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

The Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.
