We understand that sometimes absences are unavoidable, but we strongly encourage you to make every effort to ensure your child is in school every day.

A big 'thank you' to all of the parents who are working hard to support their child's attendance. Well done to those students who will be awarded with their 25 positive points for 100% attendance for the first half of Summer term.

# Attendance Reminders

If your child arrives after 9:30am we are required to mark them as having unauthorised absence for the whole morning arriving after 9:30am once in a week brings their attendance down to 90% for that week.

New attendance policies (from Aug 2024) include changes to the rules regarding term-time leave. <u>If you plan to take your</u> <u>child out of school during term time</u>, please request leave of absence in **advance** (available on our website '**term time absence' form**) and provide a valid reason.



# Summer symptoms

# Exam Phase 2 – Friday 23.5.25 – Wednesday 18.6.25 (inclusive)

From Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> May *Exam Phase 2* starts. During this phase students will attend their exams and the associated revision sessions. When they are not in an exam or a revision session they will have Home Study, where they will be expected to be working at home preparing for their next exam. Access to the library to study during phase 2 is possible for limited number of students, however permission will need to be given by myself or Mr Djaelani in advance. Please contact us if you would like your child to be considered. Mr Wellard-Jeffs and Mr Djaelani will be opening classrooms H4 and H8 each morning for Year 11 students who want to come in early to study before their exams.

A public exams handbook for Students and Parents is available to download from the school website for guidance on all aspects of the exams season, as are the official JCQ exam regulations. We recommend that you discuss these with your son/ daughter to ensure that they are absolutely clear about expectations of how they conduct themselves during exams.

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# YEAR 10 TRIP TO THE WORLD OF HARRY POTTER STUDIOS



Well done to our Year 10 students who demonstrated all our ACHIEVE values and represented the school wonderfully.


Thank you to Miss Carty for organising the trip and thank you also to so many of our staff for helping out on this and all the other amazing visits we do.

In the softly humming light of the science lab, Mrs Malanchuck and the club gathered around a tray lined with Petri dishes. Each clear plate held a tiny world borrowed from a corner of the school - Mr Barrett's feet, Theo's water bottle, the water fountain in the corridor, the toilets!. Overnight, rainbows of colonies unfurled: ivory circles like moons, amber filaments creeping like roots, and pinpricks of emerald that glowed under the lamp. We traded excited whispers, pointing out fuzzy tufts that smelled faintly of cheese and slimy clusters redolent of damp earth. With every new swab, we charted a living map of our campus, marvelling at the beauty of these unseen inhabitants.



Peering through our watch glasses, we watched rods wriggle, spirals spin, and spheres cluster in tight-knit families. It was a vivid reminder that the same communities flourish within us, too. From the

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microbes in our stomachs to the ones on our teeth, we are homes to millions of unique and diverse organisms that help our bodies digest, defend, and thrive. As we documented our plates - snapshots of the microbial world we discovered not only the life teeming around us, but also the life teeming inside, binding our school and ourselves in an intricate web of tiny allies.
