


MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

JUNIOR MATHS CHALLENGE REPORT



On May 1st, 120 of our Year 7 and 8 students took part in the prestigious Junior Maths Challenge (JMC), and once again, our students demonstrated exceptional skill and dedication. The results from the competition were a testament to their hard work and commitment, as more than half of those entered received awards.

Award Breakdown:

- Gold Awards: 7 students
- Silver Awards: 22 students

Bronze Awards: 50 students

This impressive achievement reflects not only the talent of our students but also the effective preparation they received leading up to the event.

Hayden Appleyard (Year 8):

Hayden was awarded the highest honour in the school, earning the title of *Best in School*. His outstanding performance qualified him for the *Junior Maths Olympiad*, which will take place on June 10th.

On Monday, 9th June, the whole of Year 9 will be involved in a day run by Prison, Me? No Way!



This will be our third year hosting this fantastic group, who will run sessions all day for Year 9 students. Sessions range from listening to an exoffender discuss choices, to seeing a prison cell in a van, the day includes the Red Cross teaching basic first aid, sessions about One Punch, and County Lines, as well as domestic abuse and GWR. In total PMNW are running 10 sessions for Furze Platt, with tutor groups attending 5 of these across the day.

This is going to be a fantastic day for our Year 9 students exploring social and moral issues, and we look forward to sharing photos and student experiences in next week's newsletter.

Exam Phase 2 – Friday 23.5.25 – Wednesday 18.6.25 (inclusive)

From Friday 23rd May *Exam Phase 2* starts. During this phase students will attend their exams and the associated revision sessions. When they are not in an exam or a revision session they will have Home Study, where they will be expected to be working at home preparing for their next exam. Access to the library to study during phase 2 is possible for limited number of students, however permission will need to be given by myself or Mr Djaelani in advance. Please contact us if you would like your child to be considered. Mr Wellard-Jeffs and Mr Djaelani will be opening classrooms H4 and H8 each morning for Year 11 students who want to come in early to study before their exams.

Revision Packs
