SCIENCE FAIR MAGIC – 17TH JUNE TRIP SPARKLED WITH DISCOVERY!

What an incredible day we had at the Science Fair on the 17th of June! From the moment we arrived, the buzz of innovation and discovery was in the air. Students were wide-eyed with excitement, darting from stall to stall, exploring everything from robot dogs to 3D-printed body parts.

One Year 8 student beamed to his parent upon return, *"It was all great!! I just wanted more time there."* And honestly, we couldn't agree more!

"I never thought I'd learn how to edit a news video – now I want to be a broadcaster!"

said another student, proudly showing off their clip from the BBC Broadcast Experience, where students had the chance to film mock interviews, trim their footage, and practice presenting just like real journalists.

"The AR sandbox was insane – I changed the landscape with my hands!"

added one student, fascinated by the interactive technology that responded in real-time to their sculpting.

From robot dogs to Hydro Jules and even talks on the Volatile history of science, the day was packed with hands-on fun and future-forward thinking. The 3D printers that produced body parts wowed everyone, and the National Trust's water contamination puzzles made us rethink how we protect the planet.

There were STEM professionals everywhere, sharing their journeys in marine biology, aerospace, programming, energy innovation, and future-focused engineering. We designed rockets, tackled coding challenges, and explored how to make the world better through technology and ideas.

And let's not forget the STEM Careers Quiz, where students discovered the range of roles they could explore – from tech and design to environmental science and aerodynamics.

To top it off, we saw winning projects from other schools' science fairs—a great inspiration for what's to come. This experience has only fuelled our excitement for July 7th, when we'll be selecting *our own school's winner* to go forward and represent us at The Big Bang Fair next year!

Having successfully qualified through the first round of trials a few weeks ago, on Saturday 14th June seven of our best athletes represented RBWM at the Berkshire Championships in Bracknell. This is a huge event and students who finished in the top 3 of their events are now eagerly awaiting to hear if they have been selected to go to English Schools.

- Sophie McLachlan - 2nd in 400m Hurdles Senior girls with a time of 68.3

Summer water safety

Accidents are mostly preventable with the correct knowledge and judgment and here are our tips to staying safe in the water during the summer:

To enjoy the water safely and make the right call...

- **Enter slowly and carefully**
Think carefully about your ability to splash or swim in cold outdoor water. 49% of those who lost their life were classified as swimmers*. Are you really a good swimmer?
- **Stay within reach**
Don't go too far and stay within a standing depth.
- **Always be supervised**
Over 70% of fatal accidents occur in the absence of professional supervision. Seek life guarded areas and always make sure some one is available to raise the alarm.

Summer is an amazing time to enjoy our beautiful waterways but we must be mindful that warmer weather is directly linked to an increase in fatal drowning incidents.

Rivers and Lakes/Lochs pose the greatest statistical risk as there are often hazards that the average person is equipped to handle and there is a lack of professional supervision.

In an emergency...

- **Call 999**
If you are at the coast, call 999 and ask for the Coastguard. Don't enter the water to rescue.
- **If you're in trouble FLOAT and call for help**
Fall in or become tired – stay calm, float on your back and call for help. Throw something that floats to somebody that has fallen in.
