"Throughout the 3 days I have had an excellent time understanding how the Leisure centre runs and meeting some very kind & helpful staff."

"I was fortunate enough to experience the roles of a variety of people in an office, leading to work on a project set by the team and also learnt so much about the field I am interested in for the future. Everyone was friendly and helpful! I did my work experience with RBWM sustainability and climate department.'

"I learnt that there are many parts of a game development team, all of which do more than I expected such as producers and community managers having to learn on the go to manage the games development or outreach."

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"In this placement I have learned many skills like eamwork and how much PE teachers accomplish and do I have learned how to conduct PE lessons and how to communicate with students."

"I learnt about public relations and how building a good relationship with journalists and influencers is important to a company. I also learnt the difference between buying and merchandising and how buying is numbers and creativity whereas merchandising is just numbers, and that visual merchandising is different from merchandising.

I enjoyed the public relations in food where I made a PowerPoint coming up with trends from TikTok that the M&S ambassadors could do to promote food items, I'm proud that some of the influencers may receive emails from the company and do the trends that I made a PowerPoint on."

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I learnt how the different departments all have their own weights to pull and even if one department isn't up to speed the who production process slows to a halt. I was proud to have made a functioning blanking plug that could realistically go into the aircraft. I think I would really like to go into a field such as engineering.

I learnt that there are many different and intricate factors about architecture during different stages such as planning. I learned that sites must be accessible to vehicles such as fire engines and bin lorries. It gave me an insight to how architects work and the struggles of manufacturing parts that are completely accurate to the design and how costly mistakes can be

I learnt that whilst helping children many just want support and reassurance that everything will be okay when they are feeling down. I think now i have a good connection with children and understand them on a deeper level which allows them to speak freely if something is on their mind and patience is a different level with children to understand them, so it takes time to comfort them.


Get ready for an evening of innovation, creativity, and discovery!

Year 7 and 8 students had a fantastic time this week in their Enrichment afternoons, where they could choose from a fabulous array of activities.





WATER SAFETY



With the warm weather now upon us, many families will be seeking to spend time outdoors and possibly travel to locations throughout the county and beyond that have open water, including lakes, rivers, canals, or even coastal waters - but unfortunately, higher heat means higher risk!

Latest research tells us that the risk of accidental drowning is five times higher when the air temperature is 25 degrees or higher, and every year we see a tragic spike in drownings during the hot weather. near and/or on the water.

Accidents are mostly preventable with the correct knowledge and judgment and here are our tips to staying safe in the water during the summer:

To enjoy the water safely and make the right call...

- Enter slowly and carefully Think carefully about your ability to splash or swim in cold outdoor water. 49% of those who lost their life were classified as swimmers*. Are you really a good swimmer?
- · Stay within reach Don't go too far and stay within a standing depth.
- Always be supervised Over 70% of fatal accidents occur in the absence of professional supervision. Seek life guarded areas and always make sure some one is available to raise the alarm.

Call 999

If you are at the coast, call 999 and ask for the Coastguard. Don't enter the water to rescue.

· If you're in trouble FLOAT and call for help


