The structure for the evening is as follows:




Parents/Carers should arrive at 5.50pm and make their way to the Theatre for the welcome presentation that will begin promptly at 6.00pm.

The main presentation for the evening will outline the key aspects of the Sixth Form and give important information regarding Sixth Form pathways and entry requirements, along with information on pastoral structure, extracurricular and general Sixth Form expectations.

Maps and room locations will be available when you arrive and should families wish, there will also be current Sixth Form students on hand to guide and advise you throughout the evening.

SENIOR MATHS CHALLENGE

Recently, a large number of our Year 12 and Year 13 Maths students took part in the National Senior Maths Challenge (SMC). They embraced the opportunity with ambition, perseverance and excellence, truly reflecting our school's ACHIEVE values throughout the competition. As in previous years, our students performed exceptionally well, with 29 of them earning Gold, Silver, or Bronze awards - an impressive improvement on last year's results.

Daniel Thompson in Year 13 performed outstandingly, automatically qualifying for the Andrew Jobbings Senior Kangaroo competition held on Wednesday, 19th November 2025. In recognition of their excellent achievements in the SMC, we also entered Jacob Hopson, Matej Sutton, Mitchel Holmes and Samuel Cranch for the Senior Kangaroo. Mitchell Holmes achieved the highest score among our Year 12 entrants.

Before the SMC, four Year 13 students took part in the Mathematical Olympiad for Girls. We are delighted to share that Sophie McLachlan performed exceptionally well and earned a Merit award.

As a Maths department, we are incredibly proud to offer our Sixth Form students these enriching opportunities and

even more proud of their outstanding accomplishments in these national competitions.



YEAR 10 WORK EXPERIENCE



Monday 22nd June - Wednesday 24th June

We are pleased to let you know that we will be running Work Experience for all current Year 10 pupils again this academic year. The work experience will run for three days from Monday 22^{nd} June – Wednesday 24^{th} June 2025.

We are aware that some parents reported issues with the links in the initial Parentmail message. Please accept our apologies for any inconvenience; the links below will take you to the relevant sites.

During the period of work experience all Year 10 students will be off site attending the workplace of their host employer, in England. Students who do not secure an appropriate work experience placement will be expected in school on these dates for a bespoke programme.

Work experience gives students the chance to learn about what type of job they might enjoy, and develop their CV. We know it can be one of the most transformational experiences young people have during their education.



Students (and their families) should source their own work experience placements. We are using Unifrog (www.unifrog.org) to manage the administration of the work experience programme – for example collecting information from the employer about their Risk Assessment and Health & Safety policy, as well as getting agreement from yourselves for the placement to go ahead.

Some important logistics:

- Students need to agree the placement with the employer first, and then students will get the ball rolling by adding the placement to their Unifrog account (they will find the Placements tool on their Unifrog homepage).
- The Unifrog system will then email the employer, the parent / guardian, and the school, to collect the necessary information and permissions. For the process to work,

it is essential that students add the initial information about the placement accurately.

Safeguarding our pupils is of the upmost importance. For this reason, work experience will not be approved in placements where there is only one employee. Students should be in a placement where there are multiple adults present at all times. The school holds the final right to approve or decline a work experience placement and may do so if a placement is felt to not meet the safeguarding, health and safety, liability insurance or educational needs of a young person. The school will inform parents/carers if they feel it is necessary to share any Special Educational Needs or Safeguarding information with an employer, in order to ensure a child's needs can be met.

Pupils will receive training on safeguarding themselves whilst in placement, along with how to get the most out of their work experience, expectations etc.

- You may wish to attend this year's Careers and Higher Education Fair on Tuesday 25th November from 6-8pm in the theatre and main hall. We will have about 40 employers who may be able to support with work experience.

We wish you the best of luck with supporting your child to find a placement. Please do make use of Unifrog's guides to help you. The deadline for recording your placement in Unifrog is **Friday 27th March 2026.** Please communicate with Miss Stirling if an extension is needed to record this in Unifrog.




