
SPARX MATHS - TERM 2 WINNERS

THE DANIEL SPARGO-MABBS FOUNDATION

On Monday 15th and Wednesday 17th December, a drugs educator from the Daniel Spargo-Mabbs Foundation will be speaking to all pupils at Furze Platt. These assemblies for part of our ongoing personal development and PSHE curriculums.



The DSM Foundation is a drug and alcohol education charity that was set up by Fiona and Tim Spargo-Mabbs in 2014, after their 16-year-old son Daniel died following an accidental overdose of ecstasy which contained a lethal amount of MDMA.

The aim of the charity is to support young people to make safer choices about drugs, and since its inception the Foundation has worked with students, teachers, parents/ caregivers and professionals in hundreds of schools, colleges and community organisations, mostly in London and the South East of England where the charity is based. but also more broadly across the UK and beyond.

The Foundation speaker will be telling Dan's story and covering the following:

- The effects and risks of drugs and alcohol
- Factors that affect decision making about drugs and alcohol
- Drugs and the law

Practical strategies to help young people stay safe. To find out more about the DSM Foundation, please visit its website and/or its social media channels via the link below. The website has a designated area for parents and caregivers which includes specially written content covering all of the topics that are included in workshops for young people, and additional materials on specific substances and other related topics such as parties, festivals, healthy coping strategies and more. Please do ask your child about the talk and what they heard and learned. It's a great opportunity to start or continue conversations about this important topic - and if it feels awkward or tricky, there is advice on how to broach the subject of alcohol and drugs.





CHRISTMAS TREE CARE



PREPARATION - Make sure you unwrap your tree outside and bang firmly on the ground to remove any debris and loose needles before bringing into your home.

A FRESH CUT - Make sure you take a fresh cut off the base of the trunk (at least 1 inch) before bringing the tree indoors. We can cut this for you if required.

WATER, WATER, WATER - your tree stand should have a water reservoir. You'll be amazed how much a tree will drink in the first few weeks indoors. Keep watering but note that the tree will drink less and less as the season progresses.

STANDS - Alongside the ability to provide sufficient water, you should also check your stand is suitable for the size of tree you wish to buy. Ensuring you have a solid stand is especially important if you have young children and/or pets.

NEEDLE DROP - As a fresh product, grown outdoors, trees will inevitably drop needles, the extent of which will depend on many factors.

AVOID HEAT - Don't forget that Christmas Trees are grown outdoors. Radiators are their worst enemy, so if possible turn off (or down) any radiators in close proximity to your tree.
