HEATHROW STEM PROGRAMME


We're delighted to announce that Heathrow and Learning to Work will once again be delivering the **Heathrow STEM Generation** Programme to our Year 8 students.



This fantastic Personal Development activity will take place on Tuesday 4th and Wednesday 5th November. The cohort will be split into three groups, with each group spending two hours with Heathrow and Learning to Work completing a challenge.

This challenge revolves around a 2-hour experience which is delivered by education partner Learning to Work and supported by Heathrow colleagues. They will use real-life scenarios to inspire and excite, students will learn about the many different career paths available at the airport and, using a variety of skills, will take part in a hands-on Micro: Bit robot workshop.

The workshop will be a collaborative challenge that utilises the skills of each member of the group, and allow them to practice coding, presentation skills, and designing a robot.




INDEPENDENT STUDY



BRITISH VALUES

As part of our commitment to students' Personal Development, we actively promote British Values. These are the shared principles that help everyone live and work together respectfully in modern Britain.

The aim is to help young people understand how society works and to encourage them to become responsible, caring, and active citizens.

The five Fundamental British Values are:

- 1. **Democracy** understanding that everyone has a voice and a say in decisions, whether that's through school councils, voting, or class discussions.
- 2. **The Rule of Law** learning why rules and laws are important, how they protect us, and how they help communities stay safe and fair.
- 3. **Individual Liberty** knowing that we all have rights and freedoms and learning to make safe and responsible choices for ourselves.
- 4. **Mutual Respect** showing respect for ourselves and others, even when we have different opinions or backgrounds.

Tolerance of Different Faiths and Beliefs – understanding and celebrating diversity and appreciating that others may have beliefs or lifestyles different from our own

Through lessons, assemblies, and everyday school life, we help our students see these values in action – preparing them to contribute positively to their communities and to society as a whole.




If you need to talk, we're here to listen




