For students currently in Year 9

We will be running a trip to Kefalonia, Greece next summer for next year's Year 10 students (those currently in Year 9).

We have been partnering with Flooglebinder, a travel and conservation company, for the last three years. They are the first B-Corp certified travel company and are experts in delivering educational programmes that create change for people and the planet.

During the 9-day trip students will get hands on experience of turtle conservation, they will learn about their anatomy and the important role they play in an ecosystem. As well as how to protect them and the anthropogenic impacts that are affecting their distribution and behaviours.

Given the school's own sustainable trip targets, we are confident that this trip can provide the students with an unforgettable experience while ensuring minimal social and environmental impact on the ecosystem. Turtles here we come!

YEAR 8 WILDLIFE CONSERVATION AND SUSTAINABILITY TRIP - WALES 2027

Information evening invite

Wednesday 24th June 2026 – 6pm School Theatre

For students currently in Year 7

We will be running a trip to Pembrokeshire, Wales again in the Summer of 2027 for next year's Year 8 students (those currently in Year 7).

We have been partnering with Flooglebinder a travel and conservation company for the last three years. They are the first B-Corp certified travel company and are experts in delivering educational programmes that create change for people and the planet.

On this 4-day adventure in South Wales, students will be immersed in all things wildlife, conservation, and sustainability. The Expedition also works on teambuilding, communication, and personal development skills.

Itinerary Overview

Day 1 – Bug Farm – Learn about sustainable protein sources, get up close and personal with the bugs and if you fancy it try some delicious food in the restaurant made from insect protein!

Day 2 – Coasteering – navigate the sea cliffs of Pembrokeshire with a qualified instructor, climbing the rocks and jumping into the sea.

Day 3 – Boat tour and Explore St David's – Take a trip around Ramsey Island by boat to see the seals and bird life, if you're lucky you might get a glimpse of the dolphins!

Day 4 – sustainability presentations and workshops on the beach – explore the rock pools on the beach and learn about the uses of seaweed and the effect micro plastics are having on our marine life.

SCIENCE GUEST SPEAKER

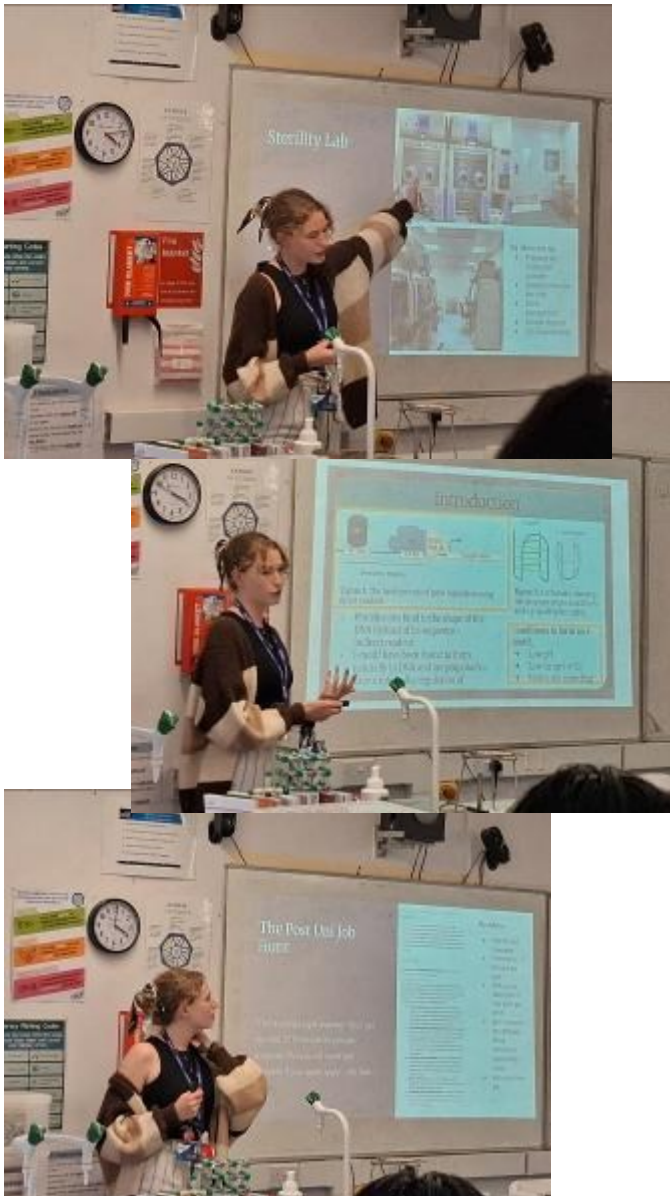


This week the Science department were delighted to welcome back Zoe Hopson as an alumna guest speaker.

BIG BANG FAIR

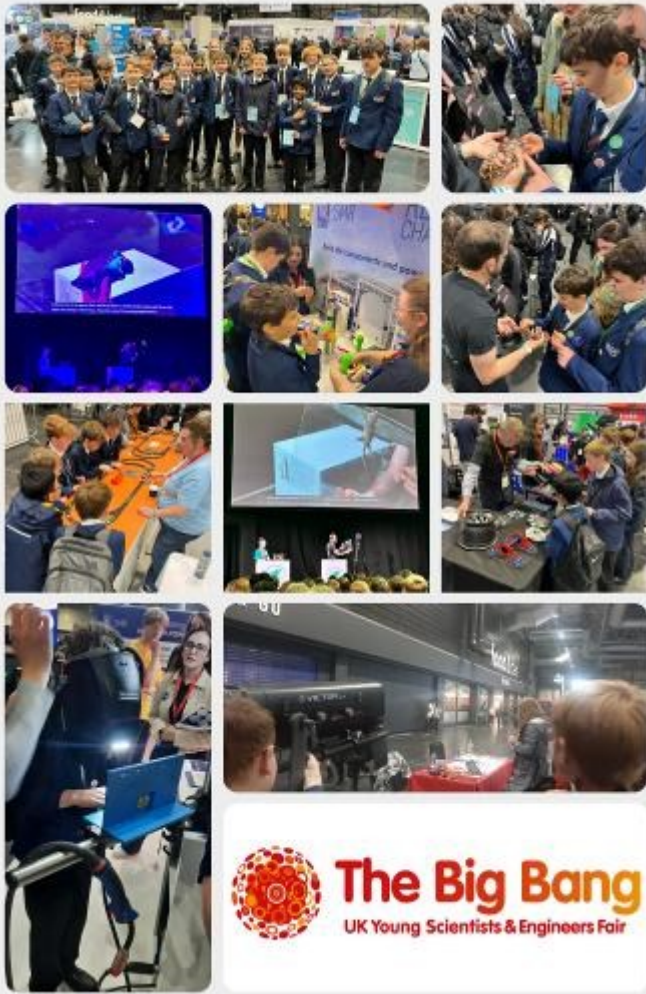


Students recently attended the East Midlands' largest Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) event, the Big Bang Fair.

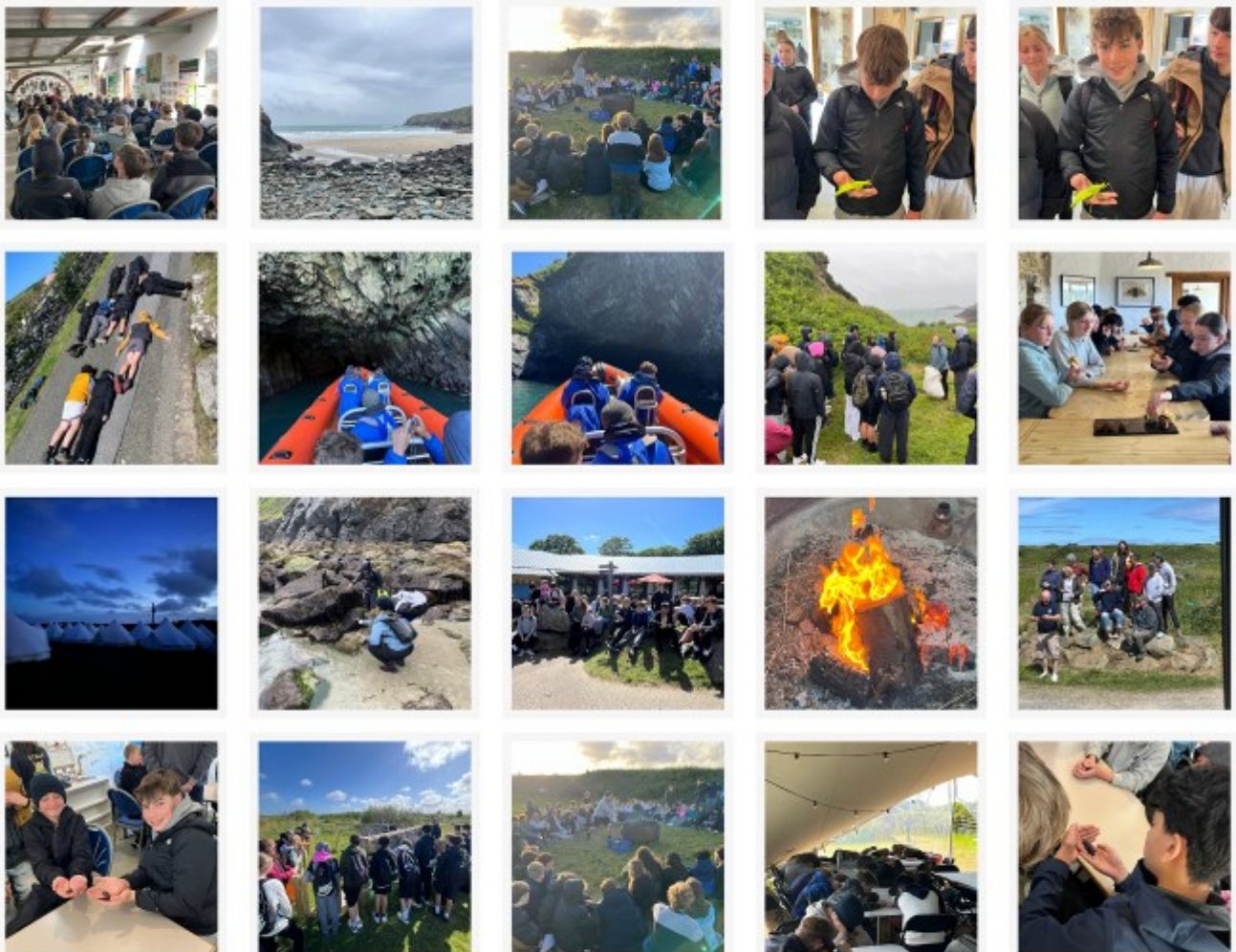
Despite some heavy rain on the first night, we were delighted to wake to glorious sunshine on the beautiful working farm at Carn-Nwchwn, set within the stunning Pembrokeshire Coast National Park.

Over the course of the visit, students enjoyed a range of exciting and enriching activities, including coasteering and boat trips along the coastline. They were fortunate to spot seals and puffins, and even had the opportunity to handle some jellyfish. Evening activities included visits to St Davids (Britain's smallest city), relaxing yoga sessions, and storytelling around the campfire.

We were incredibly lucky with the weather, enjoying sunny conditions as students explored the Welsh coastline. They took part in species identification and learned about the impact of plastic pollution. 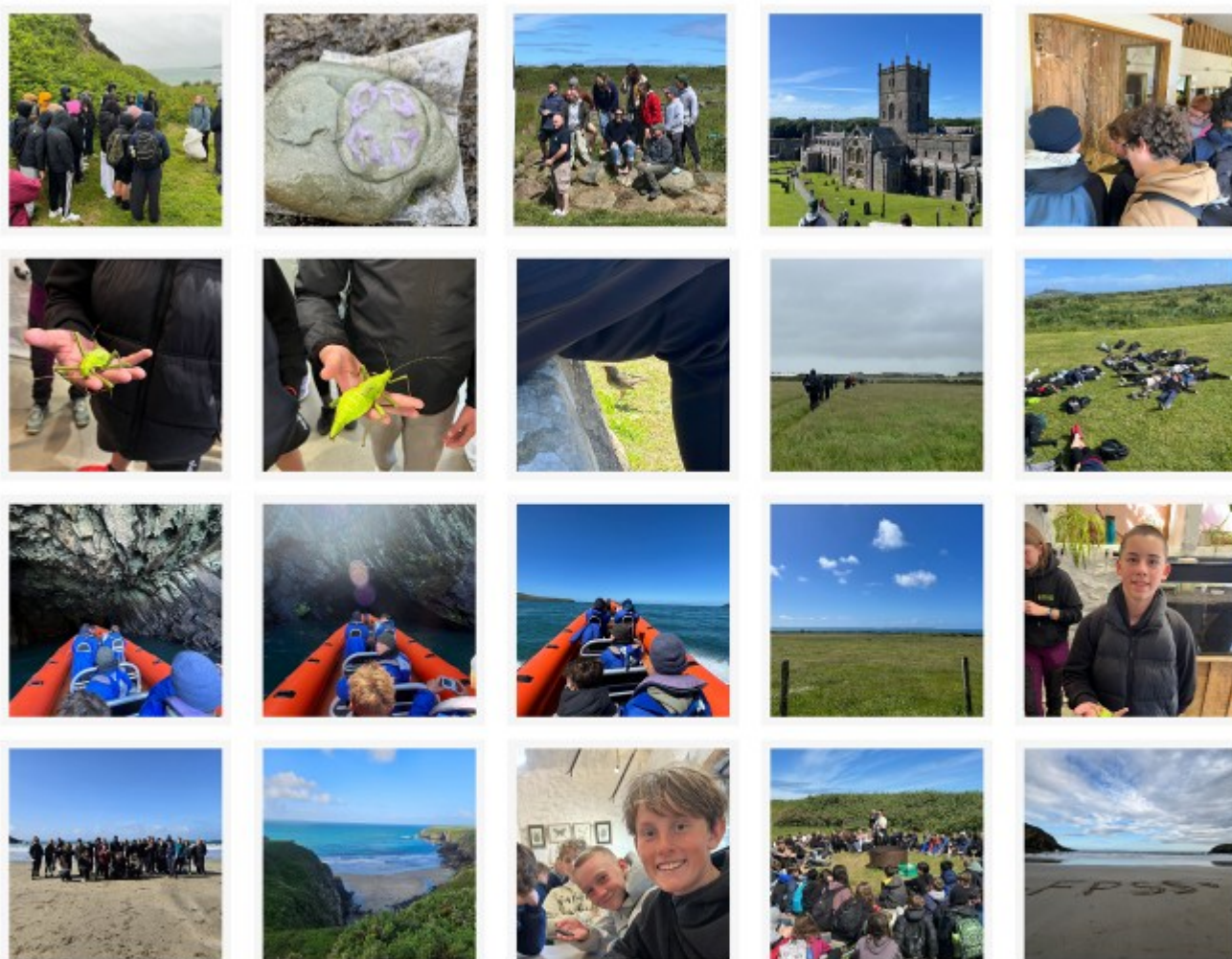

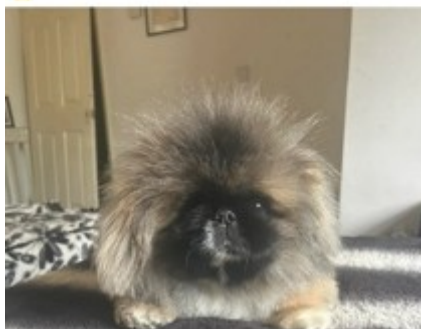

ASH research group states that 20% of 11–17-year-olds have tried vaping, an estimated 1.1 million. 7% of teenagers currently vape.

5 things you need to know:

The law

It's illegal to purchase nicotine vapes for under-18s in the UK. It is also now illegal for shops to sell single use disposable vapes. Possessing or using vapes with THC or Spice can also lead to legal trouble, including criminal charges as these are Class B drugs.

Vaping is not risk-free

While vaping is often marketed as safer than smoking, it still carries health risks - especially for young people. Vapes can contain harmful substances including nicotine, which is addictive as well as other chemicals and substance

How to help your child

Talk openly and early with your child

Start conversations about vaping early, in a calm and non-judgmental way. Ask what they know, share facts, and listen to their views. This builds trust and keeps communication open.

Be aware of the signs of vaping

Look out for signs like sweet or fruity smells, increased thirst, nosebleeds, or changes in behaviour. Vapes can be small and easy to hide, so stay observant.

What is Omoggle?

Omoggle is a new anonymous video chat site where users are paired with strangers and rated on their appearance by an AI algorithm. It's become a popular platform within the "mogging" trend where people are compared and ranked based on their looks - which has been growing quickly across platforms like Twitch and TikTok.

Why is it a concern?

The site's anonymous nature means young people can end up in an unmoderated space being judged on how they look, with no oversight. This kind of content is linked to body image issues, low self-esteem, and bullying, and it's particularly concerning for younger, more impressionable users.

Please be vigilant of your child's online activity and have open dialogue with them around what they are accessing.

For further advice and guidance the Furze Platt online safety hub has a wealth of information around keeping children safe online

As part of our online safety work Furze Platt purchases an online safety support platform for parents.

The Online Safety Hub is a online resource with lots of expert advice and guidance to help you manage your child's safety online as a parent.

It includes information on the latest hot topics when it comes to keeping children safe, such as how to manage your child's screen time, understanding the latest gaming platforms, what they mean for your child's safety and lots more.

Furze Platt families are offered a free Qustodio account facilitating parental controls on any 2 devices and free premium access for 30 days. This will allow you to gain more visibility on what's going on in your child's online world. You will have the ability to block dangerous content, introduce screen-free schedules, receive alerts for inappropriate content, keep tabs on their location and more.
