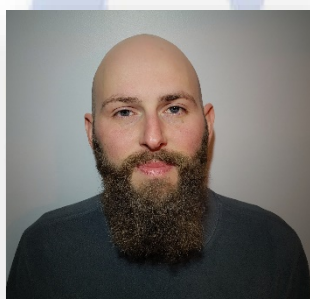
In my spare time I enjoy baking and trying our new recipes with my family.
