- House ties can be purchased on the day for £8













Welcome to Term 5

Celebrating Success

 Communication is via Iris *ParentMail* which you will sign up for as your child starts at FPSS




 It is the payment method for the school café, trips and things like lockers, revision guides etc

ParentMail



- Support classroom and home learning
- Laptops will be used in all subjects, but...
- Laptops will <u>not</u> be used all lesson, every lesson
- Monthly payments plans
- Financial support available, even if not eligible for Free School Meals





- Students can buy a laptop through the school, bring in one they already own (subject to minimum technical requirements) or buy elsewhere.
- Monthly payment plans available, without a credit check. Students eligible for
 Free School Meals on 1st September will be provided a laptop free-of-charge. We
 will not review FSM status until September 2024. Financial support is also
 available for other low-income families if needed.
- School packages include a protective case and insurance if buying the laptop elsewhere, we strongly encourage you to consider insuring it.
- We find many students struggle with the touchpad for in-class use, so you might want to buy a mouse.
- Label the laptop, case and charger with the child's name!








Behavioural Expectations

At the end of each lesson, each student is awarded an **ACHIEVE** point if they have met the following expectations:


- 1. Arrive on time and in correct uniform

Reward and Consequence Points


- Additional positive points based around our other ACHIEVE values

- Students and parents will be notified on ClassCharts



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

- Bring a rucksack make sure this can carry a laptop






Drop off and collection


