UNDERSTANDING YOUR SON OR DAUGHTER'S YEAR 7 REPORT

This report gives valuable information on your child's progress and on their attitude to learning.

Progress

We have high expectations for students in Year 7. We look at how they have done in the past including in their Year 6 SATs exams to work out what they are capable of in every subject. We therefore have different baselines or benchmarks for each student. Students do a number of assessments in each subject. We then award the following progress descriptions:

Excellent progress: at present, your child is doing better than expected.

Good progress: at present, your child is doing as expected.

Just behind: at present, your child is doing slightly less well than expected.

Cause for concern: at present, your child is doing less well than expected.

Attitude to Learning

We want students to focus well in school and at home. We award the following attitude to learning descriptions:

Outstanding: Consistently displays an attitude that promotes rapid and sustained learning.

Good: Consistently displays an attitude that enables them to make good progress.

Requires Improvement: Does not consistently display an attitude that enables them, or others, to make good progress.

Cause for Concern: Consistently displays an attitude that hinders them, or others, from making progress.

Frequently asked questions

1. Why don't you give grades to students?

Two reasons. Firstly, if you give a student a grade, they automatically ignore any feedback that is given about how to improve. And it is feedback that leads to progress, not grades. Secondly, there are no national tests or assessments for Key Stage 3 (Year 7 or Year 8), so any grades would be meaningless. Students will be given GCSE grades from Year 9 onwards.

2. My child has better attitude to learning than progress. How is this possible?

Progress information is based on how your child has done in school assessments. If you are concerned about your child's progress, then talk to their teacher and find out exactly what let them down in their assessment. Be aware that students are given feedback at the mid points of their assessments. The better students are at acting on their feedback, the better their progress will be.

3. My child got very high SATs results in Year 6 and is doing really well in Year 7, but his progress is only coming out as good rather than excellent. How is this possible?

Our expectations are based on how students did in the past. We have very high expectations of those with high SATs grades. Sometimes our expectations are so high that students struggle to exceed them so their progress comes out as good rather than excellent. If your child continues to make good progress, they are likely to get the very highest grades at GCSE.

SCIENCE COMPETITION -ENGINEERING CHALLENGE



Teams of students from Years 9 and 10 were challenged to design and build a bridge across a river to link two previously warring cities.

Guest visitor Isabel Mostyn, a Chartered Civil Engineer who is currently project managing a £60 million extension to the Emergency Department and Maternity Unit at Wexham Park Hospital, helped give valuable feedback to the teams. Students were given strict criteria and had to pitch their design to a UN panel of experts. Having built and tested their designs, the winning bridge was decided on the bases of cost of construction, its overall stability and the mass that it could hold. The students worked really well and Isabel gave them fantastic feedback on their teamwork, their design and the overall quality of the construction. She also talked about her career path, from studying engineering at Bristol University to flying Sea King helicopters in the Royal Navy and then to Project Management.

Well done to all the keen participants and congratulations to the Year 9 team who were victorious: Amber Hemsley, Holly Bird, Caitlin Murray, Rajveer Notay, Joseph Stimson, Kai Drenski, Bailey Knott and Sam Williams. Hi, I'm James Dunning, I am 15 years old and am part of the 2018 Operation Wallacea Indonesia group. We will be going to the jungle island of Sulawesi for two weeks to help with conservation work. The first week we will be deep in the jungle, sleeping outside in hammocks and gathering data from in the jungle. The second week we will be surrounded by four walls and will be scuba diving and looking at how the coral is fairing with warmer oceans.

Why help fund us?

There are a number of reasons as to why I think our trip is important enough to ask you to help fund our group all the way to Sulawesi. Climate change, deforestation and illegal poaching are all issues that

plague the news headlines, but they are also issues that are ignored and pushed aside by people. World leaders and world citizens believe that these are huge problems and in the news it can seem like "project fear". Sadly, these issues are very real issues that no one seems to be able to sort out and until there is a very clear threat, no one will do anything about these issues.

This is why our group is going out to Indonesia; to try and collect data that will be used by influential people and will change our perception of these issues, make us all understand and act. I am not asking you to donate thousands of pounds. If anything I am expecting most of you to gloss over this and think how interesting and exciting this is but then to leave it alone, let that someone else who will surely donate get involved by donating instead. We as a group of 16 are asking you to help with the issues above and to help us get out to Indonesia and collect the data. Whether it be $\pounds 5$, $\pounds 10$, $\pounds 50$ or even just $\pounds 1$, every bit of money will go to help us gather the data and evidence needed to save the unique wildlife in our jungles and world.

Year 9 students (who are currently creating their own ghost stories after seeing Woman in Black) have used the Theatre in a Box to explore how they can create tension through their staging and Year 11 students have adapted their staging ideas after trying out different staging formations. One student (shown in the photo), is being assessed in Set Design this term for his GCSE in Drama. The Theatre in a Box has been invaluable to him, allowing him to try out his many staging ideas and will also use the box in his practical moderation.

The PTFA have also supplied the Drama Department with additional staging for our many performances. With the extra sections, we will be able to stage performances in different, more exciting configurations. It also gave us the flexibility to experiment with different levels in this year's performance of His Dark Materials.
