GCSE OPTIONS EVENING

Thursday 3rd March

Important: Year 8 to choose GCSE Options this year. Year 8 GCSE Options Evening to take place on Thursday 3rd March in the Main Hall.

Furze Platt Senior School is committed to ensuring that students have a broad curriculum, enjoy their studies, and do extremely well in their examinations. After a great deal of discussion and research, we have decided that Year 8 will choose their GCSE options this year, and start their GCSE studies in Year 9. Provided below is more information about what this means, why we have decided to make this change, and what happens next, including the dates of various important parent information events.

What this means

Key Stage 4, as the GCSE stage is known, will now be three years long, and will begin in Year 9. All students will study English Language and Literature, Maths and either Double or Triple Science. They will take GCSEs in these subjects at the end of Year 11. They will study PSHE, which will not be examined. All students will also study PE and RE, and will choose whether to take GCSEs in these subjects. Students will choose 4 GCSE options, from a very wide range of subjects. They will make these choices later in Year 8. They will then start their GCSEs in Year 9, and complete them in Year 11.

Why we have decided to do this

There are three major benefits to this:

- 1. Motivation: since students will be studying subjects they have chosen, alongside other students who have chosen the same subjects, they will work harder and achieve better.
- 2. Pace: students will have longer to complete their GCSEs, allowing more time to master tricky concepts, more time to consolidate their learning, and more time to practise examination skills. This is especially important because the new GCSEs are harder than GCSEs were in the past.
- 3. Choice: By starting GCSEs in Year 9, students will be able to choose 4 options, rather than 3. This is particularly important because the government would like all students to take 'English Baccalaureate' qualifications, including one language, and either History or Geography. By starting GCSEs in Year 9, students can achieve the English Baccalaureate, and take two other GCSE subjects.

What happens next

The Year 8 Parents' Evening will be on Tuesday 23rd February from 4.15pm -7.15pm. It is vital you attend this with your son/daughter.

The Year 8 Options' Evening will be on Thursday 3rd March from 6-9pm. During this evening you will receive full information on all the options available, and will be able to meet teachers from all the option subjects. It is vital you attend this with your son/daughter.

Students will hand back their Options Forms to school by Friday 11th March.
