UNIVERSITY APPLICATIONS UPDATE

Over one hundred of our Year 13 students (82% of the year group) have now sent off their applications to universities, and are eagerly awaiting responses. Nearly 50% of these applications have included at least one Russell Group University. Over half of our students have already received achievable conditional offers from top universities, both in the UK and abroad. Three of our students have received conditional offers from the Universities of both Oxford and Cambridge to study Medicine, Law and Natural Sciences. They should be extremely proud of their achievement thus far. We also like to congratulate our four hopeful medical students, who have all received at least one conditional offer from their university choices.
