



#### IMPORTANT CHANGES TO THE SCHOOL SITE

On Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> November we will be introducing three important changes to the school site:

#### New entrance gates

Like many schools we have installed these gates to further increase site safety and to manage traffic flow. These gates will close at 8.45am each morning and re-open at 3.00pm. Students must be on school site and in their tutor base by 8.45am. Parents wishing to gain entry to the school site during the school day (either by car or on foot) can press the button to notify Reception.

#### New steps to the rear of the Astroturf

These steps mean that students who come to school via the school field can continue to enter this way over the winter months without getting muddy on the top field. They will use the new steps and the new path around the edge of the Astroturf.

### New zoning arrangements at break time for Years 8-10

We have increased the amount of outdoor seating in spaces across campus so that every year group can have its own area to socialise at break times.


