During the summer holidays a boat exploded on the River Thames near to the home of Rose Watters (Year 11).

Police and ambulance crew used the family's garden to tend to the injured, which left five people hospitalised. During the emergency Rose helped calm the children, provided towels and water and performed some first aid under the guidance of paramedics. Police and ambulance crews and the lock keeper praised Rose's actions. Ms White says, "We are all immensely proud of Rose. This incident was very serious and made the national news. A number of people were hurt and the scene was potentially distressing. Yet, Rose did what was needed and provided great comfort and practical support. Well done, Rose. 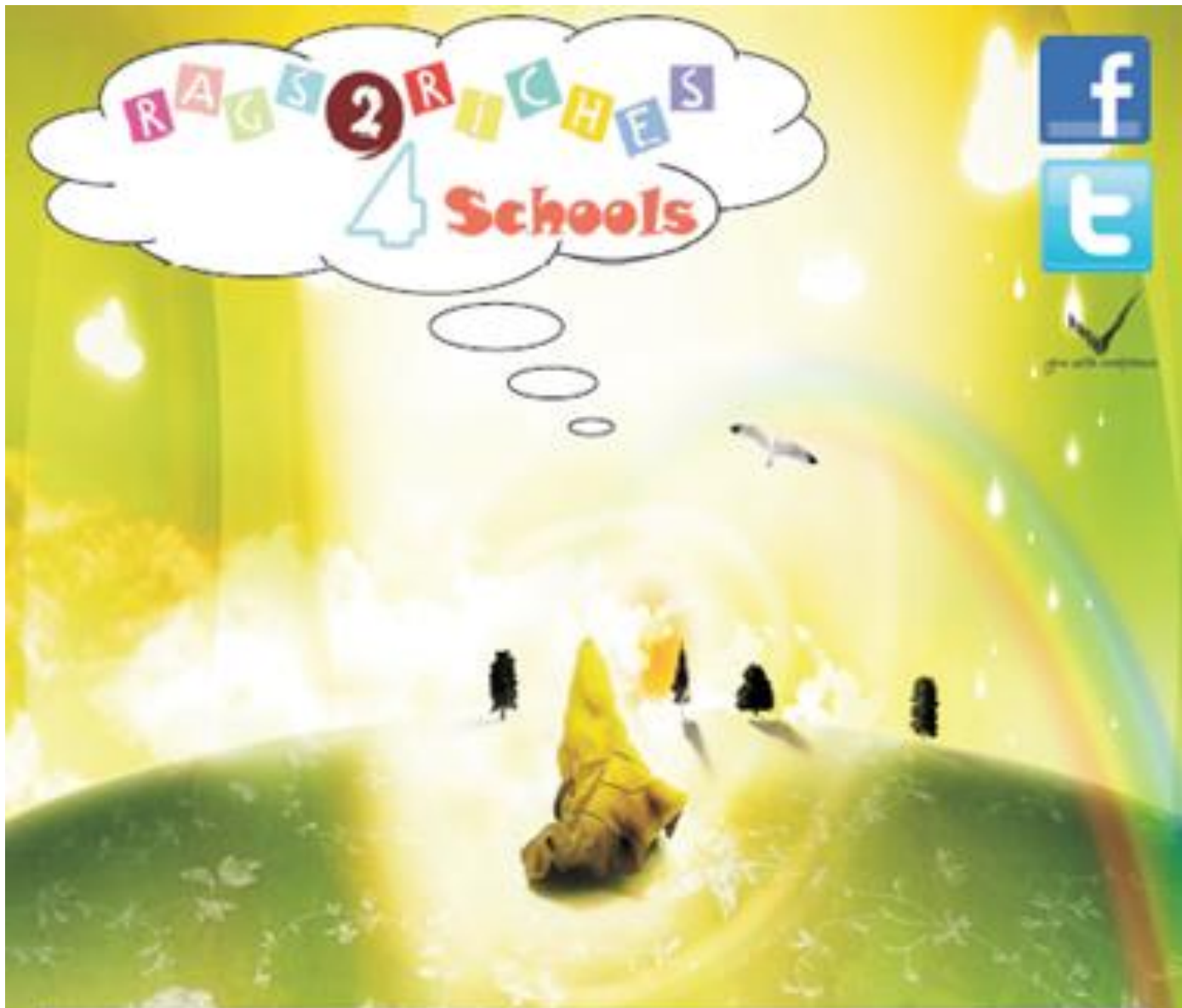
